Door-to-door Blue Cross salesmen are phonies

Blue Cross of Northeastern Pennsylvania cautions older residents to be wary of door-to-door salesmen supposedly representing Blue Cross health insurance. Bill Bachman, senior director of corporate communications for the areas' largest health insurer, says residents from the Stroudsburg, Poconos and Hazleton areas have called Blue Cross recently complaining of door-to-door sales techniques.

Bachman says Blue Cross and Blue Shield has never solicited

health insurance coverage in its 53 year history. Furthermore, all Blue Cross of Northeastern Pennsylvania employees must exhibit identification on their person. He says the current complaints of door-to-door Blue Cross sales are aimed primarily at those 65 and older. Blue Cross recommends that you secure the name, business address and phone number of individuals alleging to be Blue Cross sales representatives and report them to your local police department and the State Insurance Department in Harrisburg.

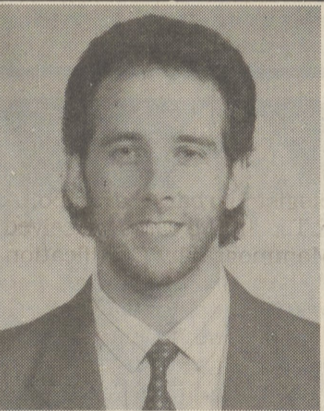
