The Center, located on Allied Services Morgan Highway campus, Scranton, opened two years ago to provide revolutionary advantages for those who suffer paralysis from spinal cord injuries. The Center's patients are given the opportunity to exercise all their muscles including those affected by paralysis. Some are able to walk again using bracing and a miniature computer to activate the muscles in sequence to propel the legs forward.

Brady completed undergraduate work at College Misericordia, Dallas. She earned a Master's Degree at the Marywood College School of Social Work, Scranton.

Brady has been associated with Allied Services since 1982. She previously served as director of Social Services at Allied's John Heinz Institute of Rehabilitation Medicine, Wilkes-Barre Township.

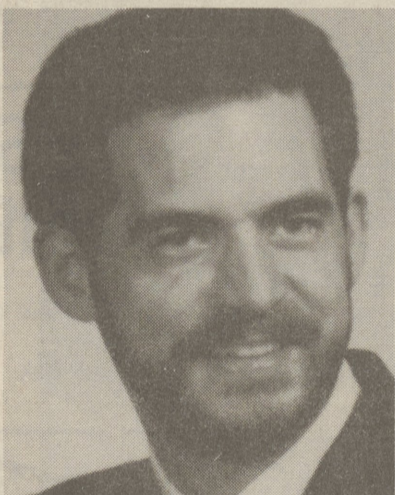

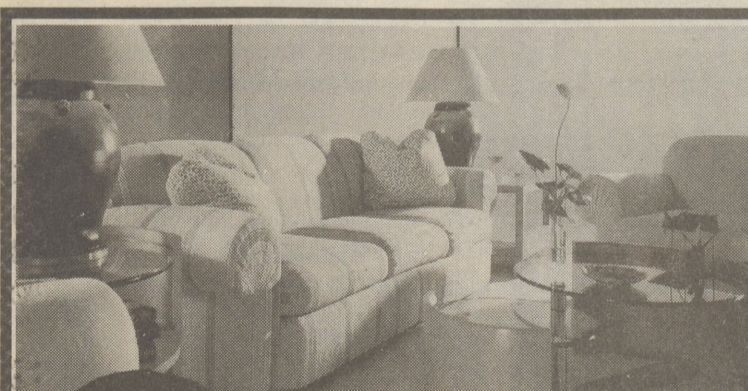
### MARINE PFC. JAMES FRY COMPLETES RECRUIT TRAINING

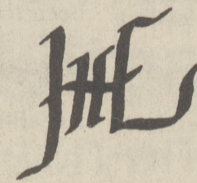
