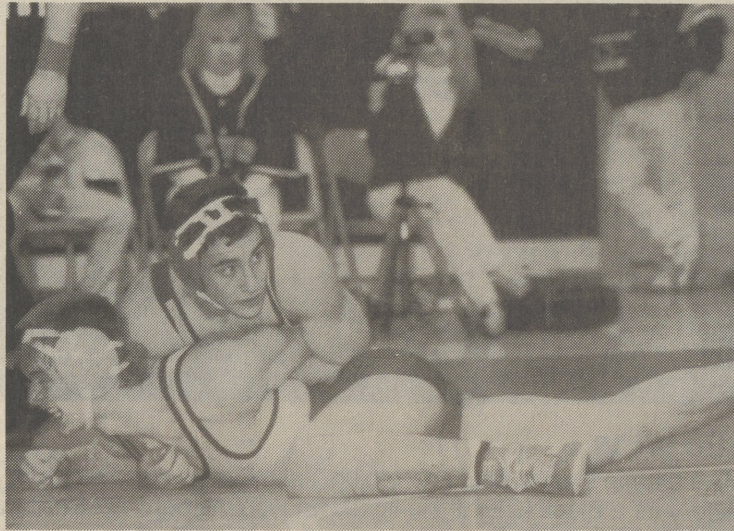
She was preceded in death by her husband of 54 years, Howard.

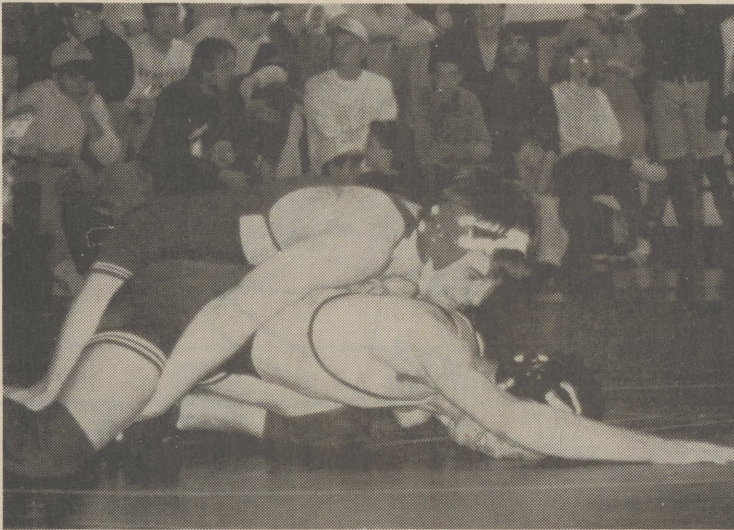

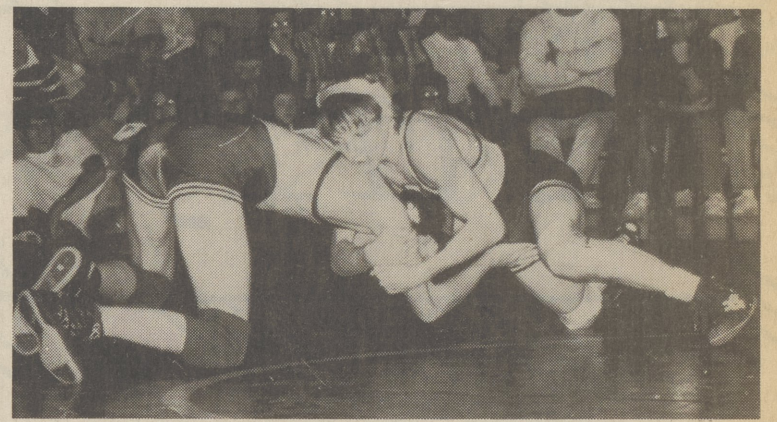
GLEN ELLSWORTH has been a strong performer for Dallas.
