

Wilkes University's Upward college. Bound program recently accepted 14 high schools in Luzerne and Wyoming counties.


Funded by the U.S. Department of Education, Upward Bound Program at Wilkes University began in 1967 and helps high school students grow academically, socially and personally while preparing for
