Lehman students join together to help their peers

Every month a group of Lake-Lehman students meet in one of their homes to discuss and to create solutions for the many problems that plague high school students. These caring students are peer helpers.

The peer group consists of twenty-two members from grades nine through twelve and is led by guidance counselor Flossy Finn. The Peer Helpers program is designed to help troubled students, aid faculty, perform community services and discourage substance abuse. "Peer Helping has been proven to have a significant impact on drug and alcohol prevention," said group leader Flossy Finn.

During the 1991-92 school year, the peer group took part in a nation wide suicide prevention program, Life Pact and will be entering Lehman's elementary schools to run an alcohol prevention program under the supervision of Wy-

oming Valley Drug and Alcohol preventionist Pam McDonald. In March, they will be traveling to Kutztown in order to be presenters at The Pennsylvania Peer Helpers State Conference. They will also enter Lake-Lehman's elementary schools to take part in The Reading Olympics. Peer helping is not only limited to the school day. This Christmas, the Peer group took their services out of the school system and into the homes of two underprivileged families, giving them a Christmas tree and presents for their children.

A peer helpers most significant contribution to the school system is one-to-one counseling. The peer group deals with students who have problems of all sorts, from alcohol counseling to tutoring. Karen Stefanowicz, a senior peer helper at Lake-Lehman, says "Many times a student needs a peer to listen without judging him or her. A peer helper can be an excellent way to release the pressures of everyday high school life."
