Dallas schedules kindergarten registration for March 15 to 19

Kindergarten registration in the Dallas School District for the 1992-93 school year will be held in the Dallas Administrative Office Building, Church Street, Dallas, on March 16, 17, 18, and 19.

Hours will be from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. A birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of age must accompany each registration. A child must be five years old on or before September 30, 1992 to be eligible for kindergarten.

Those with last names beginning with A, B, C, D, and E will register on Monday, March 16; those with last names beginning with F, G, H, I, J and K on Tuesday, March 17; those with L, M, N, O, P,

Q and R on Wednesday, March 18; and those with S, T, U, V, W, X, Y, and Z on Thursday, March 19.

The children who will enter first grade, but did not attend the Dallas kindergarten program this past term, may register on Thursday, March 19.

In addition to the registration, vision, speech and hearing screenings will be given.

The school officials need to review the child's immunizations to be certain state's immunization standards. Parents are to bring all records of their child's immunizations. If the student's records do not meet the standards, he/she will not be able to attend school.

WHAT IS FARSIGHTEDNESS?

Farsightedness, or hyperopia, is a vision condition in which a person is better able to see clearly at far distances than at near distances. A farsighted person, for instance, may be able to read a street sign a block away with no difficulty, but have trouble reading his morning newspaper.

Nearly everyone is born with some degree of farsightedness and some people with extremely mild cases may not require treatment. The majority of farsighted people, however, can benefit greatly from optometric treatment. This includes corrective glasses, contact lenses and/or vision therapy to help

them see clearly. Because it is difficult to discover farsightedness in the typical school vision screening, parents, teachers and school nurses are advised to look out for its signs. These include: difficulty in concentrating, eye or general fatigue, poor reading ability, and holding reading material away from the eyes. In any event, the optometrist can make a positive diagnosis with a complete optometric examination.

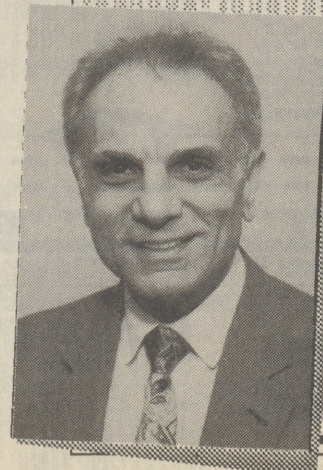
