Notice is hereby given that sealed Bids will be received by the Dallas Area Municipal Authority (DAMA), as Owner, for furnishing all tools, equipment, materials, labor and appurtenances necessary and required for the construction of a New Sewage Pump Station and Force Main, complete, in place, tested and ready for service, in accordance with contract documents. Plans and Specifications have been prepared by Roy F. Weston, Inc., Consulting Engineers for the Project.

The project will consist of three (3) separate prime contracts:

Contract A - General Construction for Sewage Pump Station

Contract B - Electrical Construction for Sewage Pump Station
Contract C - Force Main Construction

Bidders may submit separate Bids for any contract or contracts for which they are qualified to bid by law.

Sealed Bids will be received by the Dallas Area Municipal Authority (DAMA) at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 530 South Memorial Highway, Shavertown, Pennsylvania 18708-9603 until 1:30 P.M. prevailing standard time on May 7, 1992. Bids received after this time will not be accepted. The Authority will not be responsible for mailed bids that are not received by the 1:30 P.M. May 7, 1992 deadline.

The project consists of construction of a submersible pump station and approximately 3.85 miles of 18 inch diameter sewage force main, and decommissioning of the DAMA Treatment Plant.

All interested parties are invited to attend the Dallas Area Municipal Authority bid opening meeting at the DAMA Wastewater Treatment Plant, 530 South Memorial Highway, Shavertown, Pennsylvania 18708-9603 on the above date. Bids will be opened publicly at 7:30 P.M. prevailing time and read aloud.

A pre-bid meeting will be held at the Dallas Area Municipal Authority Wastewater Treatment Plant, 530 South Memorial Highway, Shavertown, Pennsylvania 18708-9603 on April 9, 1992 at 10:00 A.M. prevailing standard time. To qualify as Bidder, it is mandatory to attend the pre-bid meeting.

All bids shall remain irrevocable for sixty (60) days after the actual date of the opening thereof unless delayed due to the required approval of a government agency, the sale of bonds, or the award of a grant or grants, in which case bids shall be irrevocable for one hundred twenty (120) days in compliance with Act 317 of 1978 approved November 20, 1978.
