Misericordia children's program set for April 6-11

The production, entitled "Along the Susquehanna," will be held April 6-11 in Misericordia's Merrick Hall. Admission is \$2 per person, with no charge for group chaperones.

Members of the Bloomsburg Theatre Ensemble will present a lively series of short stories about a turtle, squirrel, frog and ground hog, as told by Indians who lived along the Susquehanna River in Pennsylvania many years ago. Volunteers are being sought by the Wyoming Valley Unit of the American Cancer Society for office assistance.

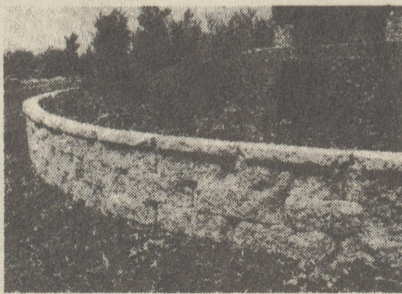
