Dallas Township

1-VEHICLE ACCIDENT AT CHESTNUT RIDGE

According to Dallas Township police, a 1979 Chevrolet Malibu operated by Michael A. Callahan, 70, of Ashley was involved in a one-car accident on Route 309 near Chestnut Ridge Monday, April 20, shortly after 3:15 p.m. Police said that the Callahan vehicle was traveling south on route 309 when it crossed over the northbound lane and berm, traveling 51 feet along the embankment, returning to the berm, where it traveled an additional 135 feet. The car then jumped the embankment, running over several tree stumps and traveling another 71 feet, finally coming to rest against a utility pole, police said. Callahan stated to police that he is on medication and must have blacked out. His car was towed from the scene.

2 VEHICLES INVOLVED IN SIDESWIPE CRASH

According to Dallas Township Police, a 1990 Honda Prelude operated by Traci Ertley, 22, of

Dallas and a 1989 Volkswagen operated by Donna L. McDermott, 25, of Sweet Valley, were involved in a sideswipe accident Monday, April 20, shortly before 5 p.m. Police said that the McDermott vehicle was traveling east on Country Club Road when the Ertley vehicle pulled out from the stop sign on Irem Road. The point of impact was in the intersection, police said. Ms. Ertley stated to police that she had difficulty shifting her car on the hill.

2 VEHICLES COLLIDE AT LAKE ST. AND COUNTRY CLUB RD.

According to Dallas Township police, a 1987 Ford Bronco operated by Edward L. Jones, 79, of Harveys Lake and a 1988 Ford Tempo operated by Mark Stredny, 28, of Dallas, were involved in an accident on country Club Road at the Lake Street intersection Wednesday, April 22. Police said that the Jones vehicle had been traveling east on Country Club Road, while the Stredny vehicle had been traveling south on Lake Street. Stredny stated to police that he hit his brakes and cut to

the left in an attempt to avoid hitting the Jones vehicle. After the point of impact in the intersection, the Jones vehicle turned to the right, hitting a stop sign and a street sign.

Oliver had been crossing Route 309 from Carverton Road to Church Road with the green signal, police said. His car spun 180

degrees and traveled up Church Road. Zavada's truck careened from Oliver's car, and struck another vehicle driven by Joanne Louise Parrish, of Hazeltine Street, Shavertown. Parrish was making a left turn from Church Road to northbound Route 309, police said.

No one was injured in the accident. Investigating officer was Ptl. Walter Davis.
