Bluegrass with bite at Chicory House May 8

Bluegrass with bite! That's the specialty of Pavlov's Dawgs, the adventuresome quartet from the Lehigh Valley that will be playing the Chicory House in Wilkes-Barre Friday, May 8.

The nonprofit, volunteer-operated Chicory House, Northeastern Pennsylvania's only venue dedicated to presenting folk music, holds its coffeehouse concerts in the Community Room of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, South Franklin Street across from Boscov's in downtown Wilkes-Barre. The Pavlov's Dawgs Concert will begin at 8:30 p.m. Doors will open at 8.

Pavlov's Dawgs guitarist Jesse Grim says, "I like to call our music bluegrass with a four-barrel carburetor and dual exhausts. More than just a hot bluegrass band, though, in the few years that they have been playing, Pavlov's Dawgs have created their own niche by infusing elements of jazz, blues, Celtic, rock and reggae, as well as other contemporary sounds, into their music.

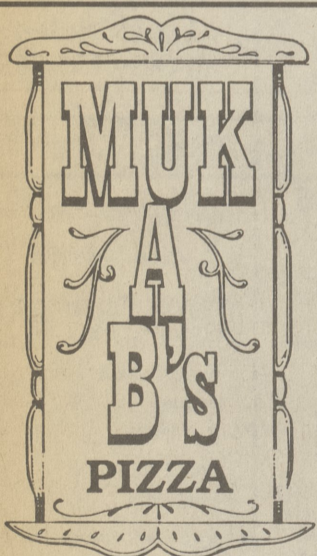
