Jean Fader's art on display

Drawings and paintings by Dallas artist and illustrator Jean Fader will be on display in the lobby of the Dallas branch of United Penn Bank, Main Street, through the end of May.

The artworks consist of pastels, watercolor and pastel, and watercolor and ink. Many of the works were inspired during family vacations from Maine to New York. Fader composes her art from sketches done on location and reference photographs she takes while visiting the various sites.
