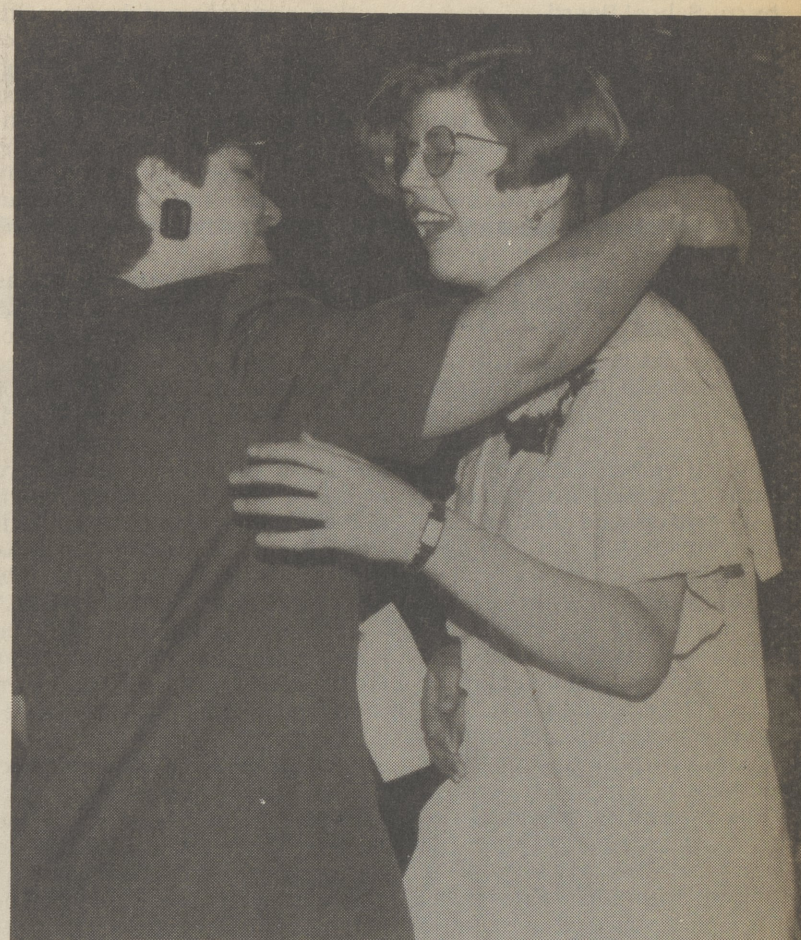

The magazine company, Q.S.P. Corporation, treated 12 students

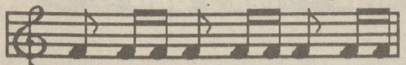
who sold 18 or more subscriptions to lunch at a local restaurant. The company transported them in style by limousine to the local eatery.
