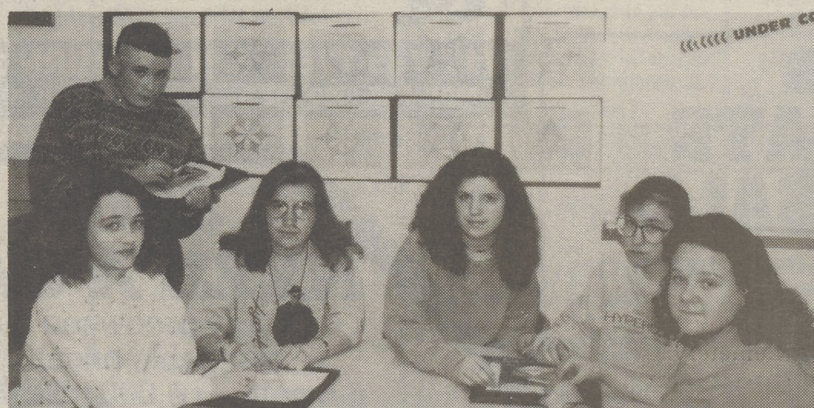

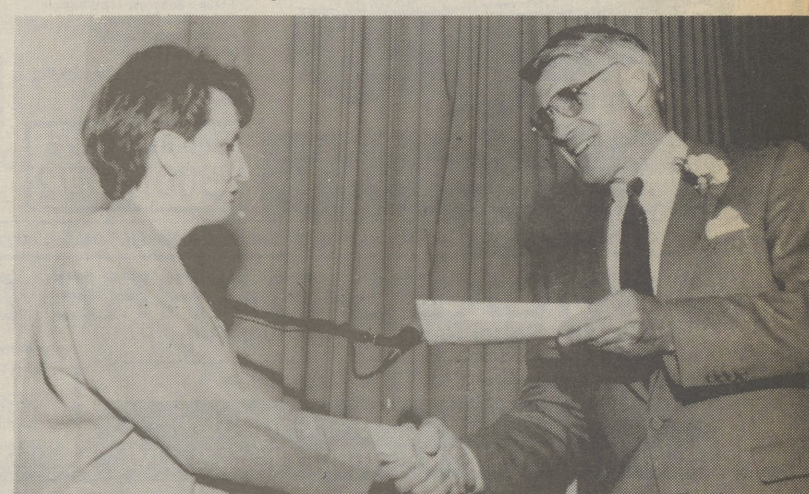
### Dallas students turn Geometry into art
