'Guilt by Assassination,' next at the Music Box

Music Box Players to present original musical whodunit: *Guilt by Assassination*

The Music Box Players, a non-profit theatre company, will present an original musical murder-mystery: *Guilt by Assassination*, on June 26, 27, 28 and July 9, 10, and 11, at The Music Box Dinner Playhouse, 196 Hughes Street, Swoyersville.

The author (book and lyrics) is Kevin Costley, current general manager and board member of the Players.

The composer of *Guilt By Assassination* is Ted Anderson, who has written 12 original songs. Mr. Anderson is a resident of Kingston, and has been affiliated with the Players since 1983. He and Costley have collaborated on several original musical plays for children.

Guilt By Assassination, the first original play to be written for the Playhouse's "mainstage" series, begins on a winter night in 1899, when the Royal Family of Pandamania, an insignificant little principality in Central Europe, gathers for a dinner party. They are joined by the ambassador of a hostile neighboring kingdom, his family, and 2 uninvited guests. After a freak avalanche isolates the palace

from the outside world, the murders begin. Is it the assassin or one of the guests who is committing the crimes? Is the motive political or personal? Is it "guilt by association" or "guilt by assassination?" Only the

murderer knows for sure, and it would be "criminal" to divulge the neat plot twists and turns that occur before the audience finds out—"whodunit!"

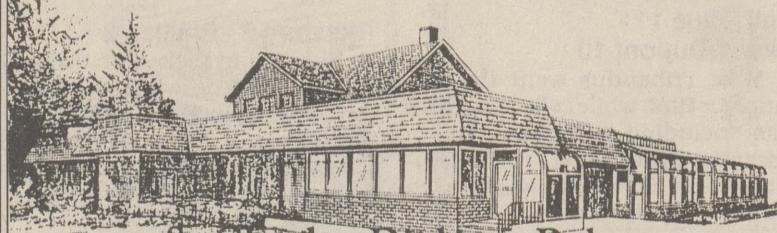

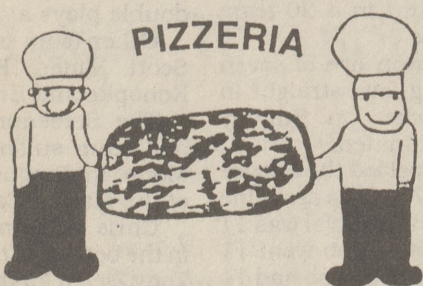
