

Dallas Township to buy another new police cruiser

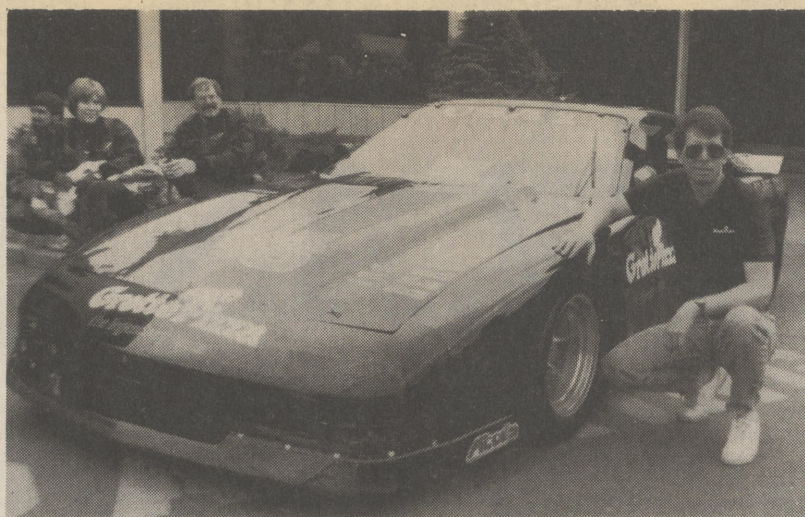
Dallas Township will have another new police cruiser on the road within the next three weeks. Supervisors authorized the purchase of a 1992 Chevrolet cruiser for \$13,000 to replace the township's 1988 vehicle. Once it is delivered and special police equipment installed, the new police car will be ready for service.

In other business, Frank Wagner reported that the new town-

ship equipment garage's overhead doors have been installed. The building will be ready for use once the electrician wires the door opener and motors.

The supervisors reminded all property owners to keep weeds and grass on properties along roadways and at intersections cut so that drivers have better visibility.

The next regular supervisors' meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 7, at 7 p.m.

Harveys Lake teen drowns

Lucas Kreidler, 17, of Harveys Lake, accidentally drowned Friday, June 20 while fishing and swimming with friends at a pond near the Lake Summit Rod and Gun Club in the Outlet section of Harveys Lake.

Kreidler had been fishing with two friends, Rocky Vigorito and Tad Chesbrough, when the trio decided to go wading in the spring-fed pond. After swimming into deeper water, Kreidler apparently suffered muscle cramps in the cold water and went under.

After an unsuccessful attempt to pull him from the water, Vigorito and Chesbrough ran to a construction crew working nearby on Meeker Road for help. Crew members called 911 for help after they were unable to rescue Kreidler.

Emergency crews were first sent to the Harveys Lake Rod and Gun Club, in the Alderson section on the opposite side of the lake. Nearly half an hour elapsed before a second call directed rescue personnel to the correct location.

Harveys Lake Ambulance Captain Ken Carey said that Kreidler had been pulled from the water by the time that the ambulance crew arrived on the scene.

Kreidler was pronounced dead at 4:20 p.m. at Nesbitt Hospital. "This mixup was a very unfortunate thing," Carey commented. "The caller was very excited; no one was really at fault."

Carey urged the public, when calling 911, to try to give the emergency dispatcher as correct and complete information as possible so that rescue personnel can get to the scene quickly.

Work to begin soon on Parrish, Davenport streets

Dallas Borough council appointed Leo Corbett as engineer for a capital improvements project at its regular meeting Tuesday, June 16.

Funded by a \$50,000 grant from the Luzerne County Office of Community Development, the project includes improvement of storm drains in the Parrish and Davenport Street area. Council expects work on the project to begin in early July.

In other business, William Roberts submitted a list of streets to be paved, including Highpoint Acres, Maplewood Drive, Lackawanna Ave., West Hickory St.,

Baldwin Ave., Terrace Ave., Monroe Ave., King St., West Center Hill Road and the area behind the borough building.

Roberts also reported that the road crew plans to begin work to correct a water drainage problem on Machell Ave. near Split Rail Lane. The road crew has patched Reservoir Road and is also patching potholes.

Borough Manager Milt Lutsey reported that architect Harry Seargent has inspected the borough's storage building and has found it sound enough to add a maintenance and storage bay for borough vehicles.

The next regular borough council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 14, at 8 p.m.
