Harveys Lake teen drowns

Lucas Kreidler, 17, of Harveys Lake, accidentally drowned Friday, June 20 while fishing and swimming with friends at a pond near the Lake Summit Rod and Gun Club in the Outlet section of Harveys Lake.

Kreidler had been fishing with two friends, Rocky Vigorito and Tad Chesbrough, when the trio decided to go wading in the springfed pond. After swimming into deeper water, Kreidler apparently suffered muscle cramps in the cold water and went under.

After an unsuccessful attempt to pull him from the water, Vigorito and Chesbrough ran to a construction crew working nearby on Meeker Road for help. Crew members called 911 for help after they were unable to rescue Kreidler.

Emergency crews were first sent to the Harveys Lake Rod and Gun Club, in the Alderson section on the opposite side of the lake. Nearly half an hour elapsed before a second call directed rescue personnel to the correct location.

Harveys Lake Ambulance Captain Ken Carey said that Kreidler had been pulled from the water by the time that the ambulance crew arrived on the scene.

Kreidler was pronounced dead at 4:20 p.m. at Nesbitt Hospital.

"This mixup was a very unfortunate thing," Carey commented. "The caller was very excited; no one was really at fault.

Carey urged the public, when calling 911, to try to give the emergency dispatcher as correct and complete information as possible so that rescue personnel can get to the scene quickly.


