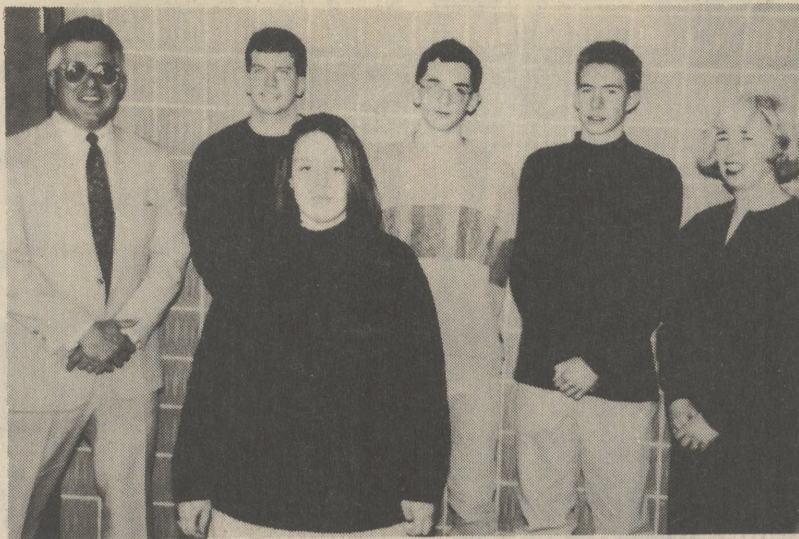

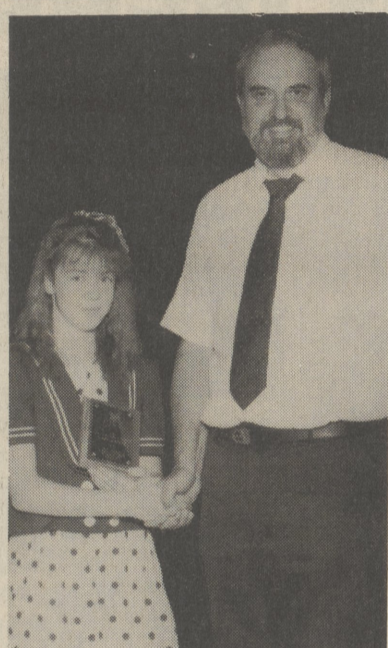
### Little People graduates

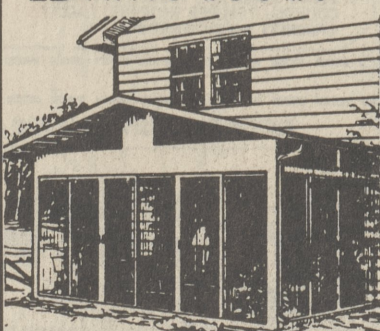

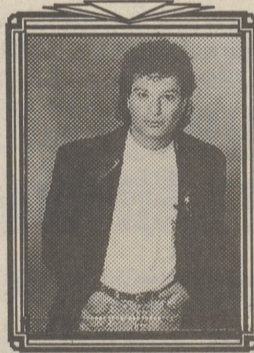

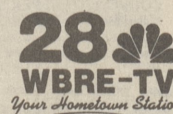
