Traveling in 21 vehicles from their winter base in Sarasota, Florida, the circus performs in 18 states from Florida to Maine, usually

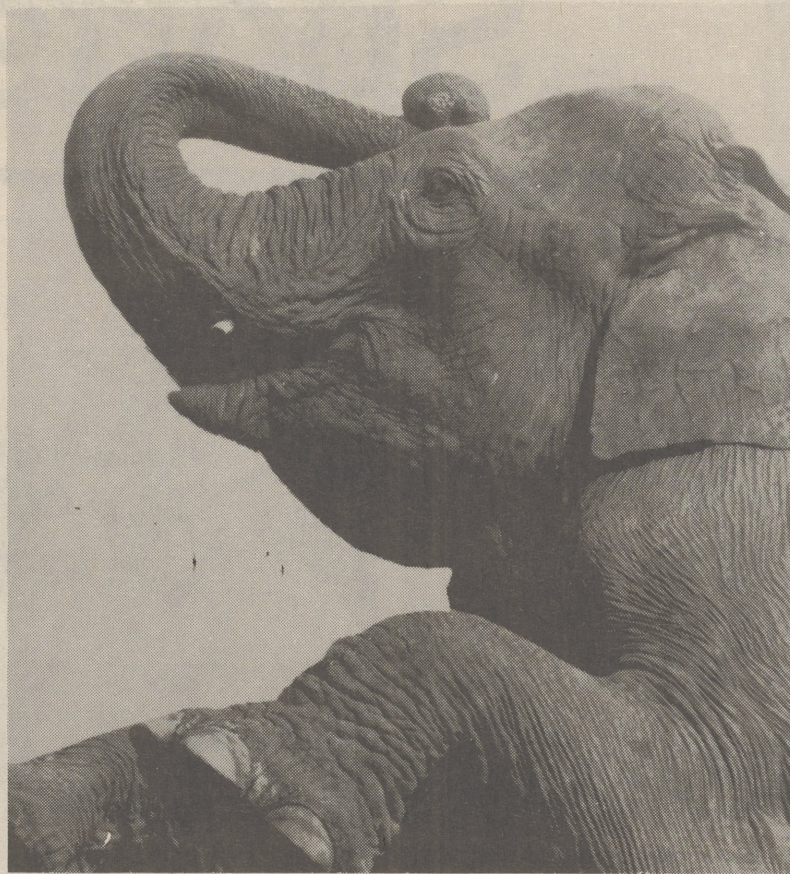
stopping to perform in a different town each day of the week.
