

Dave Dacy will be at the controls of the big, blue Super Stearman bi-wing aerobatic aircraft while Johnny Kazian is anywhere but in the passenger seat. Dacy puts the aircraft through a complete low level aerobatic performance including loops, rolls, hammerhead turns, and high speed dives while Kazian is out on, between, or under the wings of the aircraft. While on top of the Super Stearman Kazian performs his own routine that includes his trademark, a headstand.


