

Kingston Twp. supers pull subdivision's approval

The Kingston Township supervisors revoked the approval granted to the Maplecrest Phase II subdivision at their meeting July 8.

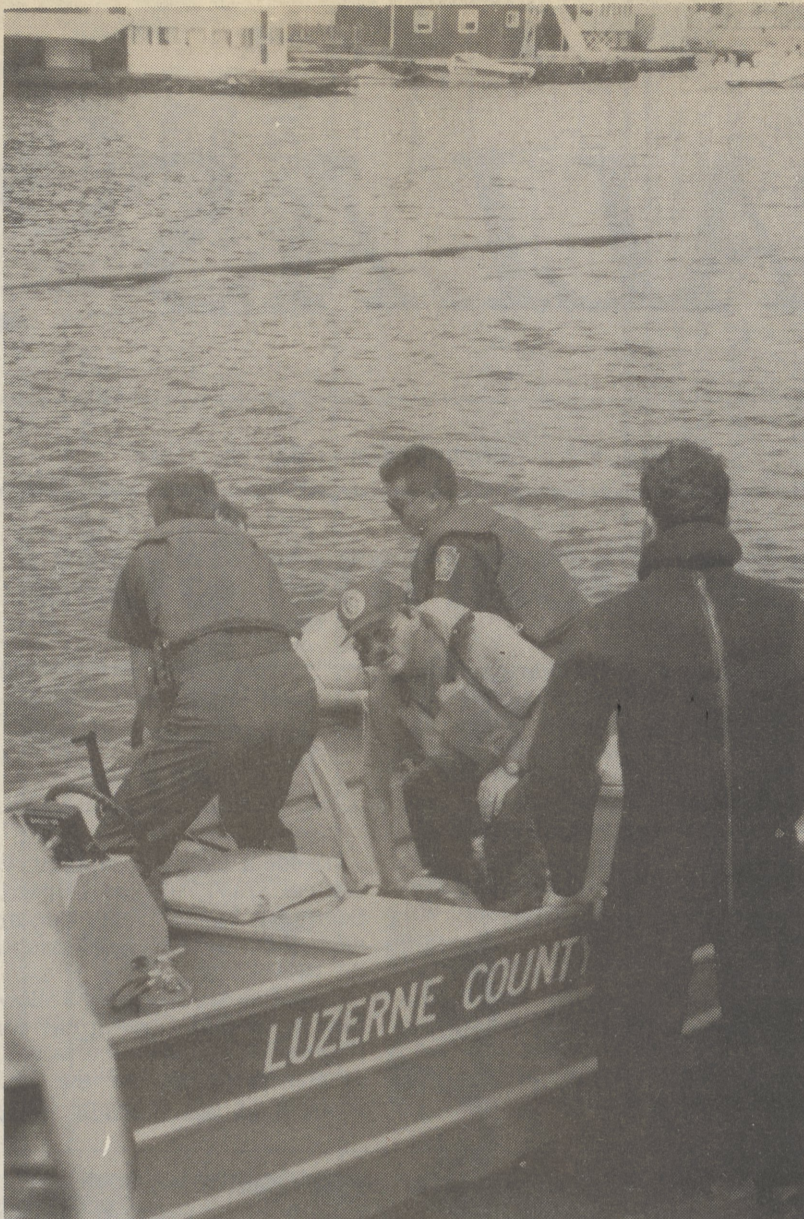
According to township manager Jeff Box, the approval was revoked because the developer failed to provide \$360,000 in financial security to guarantee that public improvements such as roads, water, and sewers called for in the subdivision plans would be completed.

Approval was granted for the 30-lot subdivision to John Moreck of Kingston in May of 1990. Moreck

was supposed to provide the financial security for the subdivision within 90 days of the approval. No homes have been built on the land so far.

The township supervisors also authorized solicitor Benjamin Jones to file liens against two property owners who haven't cut their lawns in a year, a violation of the township's vegetation ordinance. Both properties, one at 41 East Center Street and another at 89 Shagbark Lane, are vacant.

The Center Street home was damaged by fire, and the owner of the Shagbark Lane home has gone to Australia.

PTA commended for playground fundraising

The Lake-Lehman school board commended the Lehman-Jackson Elementary School PTA for its work in raising funds for new playground equipment at its meeting July 7.

Three different modules — for kindergarten through second grade, third and fourth grades and fifth and sixth grades — contain activities geared to the students' abilities and interests. In addition to raising the money, PTA members installed the equipment.

In other business, the board contracted with Luzerne Intermediate Unit #18 for special education services for students not provided for in the district, at a cost of

\$667,667.

The following bids totaling \$47,222.60 were awarded for carpeting for the hallways in the Lehman-Jackson building, insurance and science lab supplies:

- \$32,500 for carpeting from Carpet Warehouse in Taylor. (This bid came in \$9,500 under the amount originally budgeted.)

- \$10,108 for student accident insurance and sports and activities insurance through Robert Laux agency in Wilkes-Barre. (This bid came in \$1,000 over the amount originally budgeted.)

- \$4,614.60 to ten companies for science lab supplies.

The board voted to adopt a new series of math textbooks for kindergarten through sixth grades.
