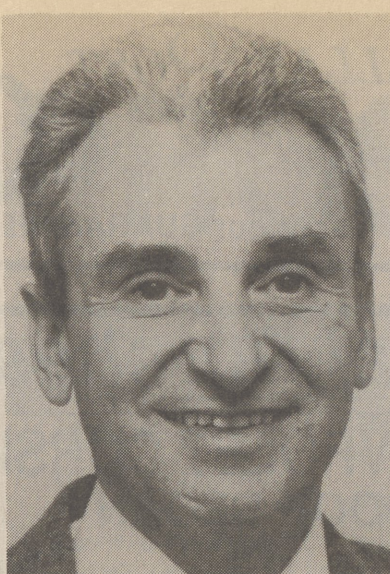
ter Member of the Trucksville Fire Company.
