

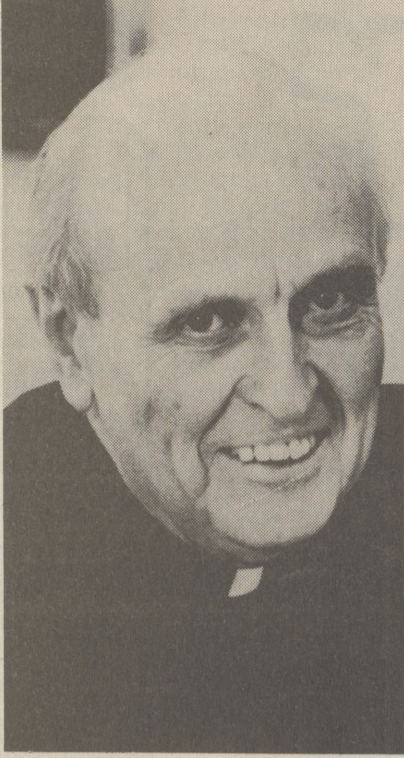

Ethics Institute will celebrate Ethics Day September 10

The Ethics Institute of Northeast Pennsylvania will celebrate Ethics Day on Thursday, Sept. 10. The opening ceremony will be held on Public Square, Wilkes-Barre at noon, attended by music, speakers and balloons.

The main event of Ethics Day will be a dinner, held at 7 p.m. in the Convention Center, Economic Development Council of Northeast Pennsylvania, Laflin. Representative Kevin Blaum will introduce the Reverend Robert F. Drinan, S.J., Professor of Law, Georgetown University, Washington, D.C. Howard Grossman, Economic Development Council, is chairing Ethics Day.

Father Drinan, dubbed "our Father who art in Congress" by his constituents, served for 10 years as a member of the House of Representatives, 4th District, Mass. He has written many books and articles, is a regular contributor and columnist for several established periodicals and founded the *Georgetown Journal of Legal Ethics*.

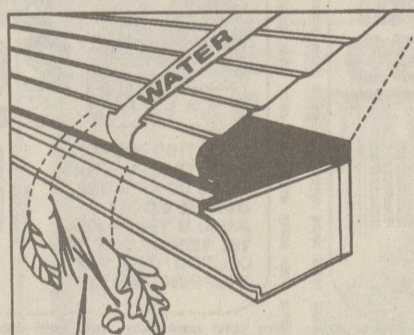
