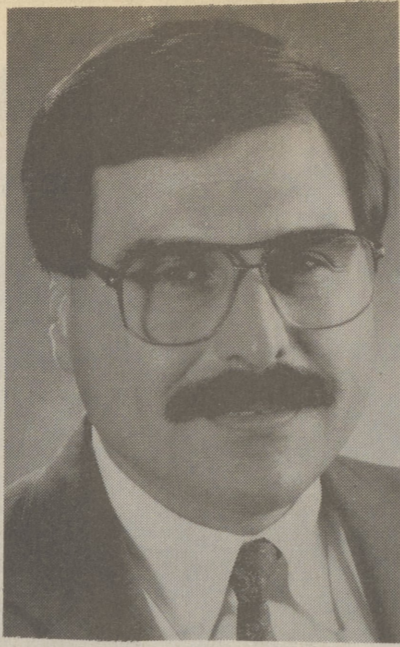

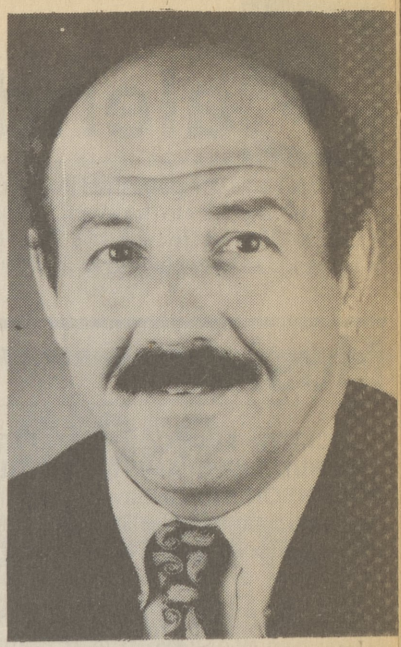

He also served as director of physician affairs for Pennsylvania Voluntary Hospitals of America and

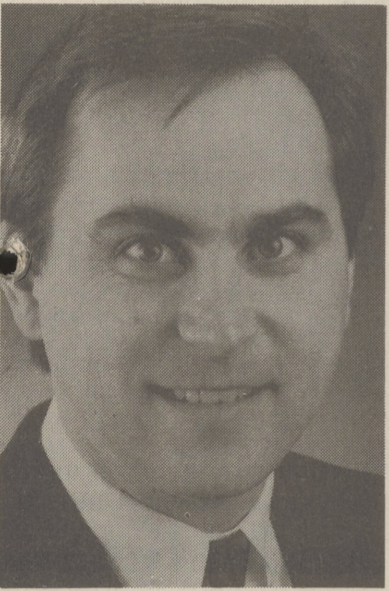
