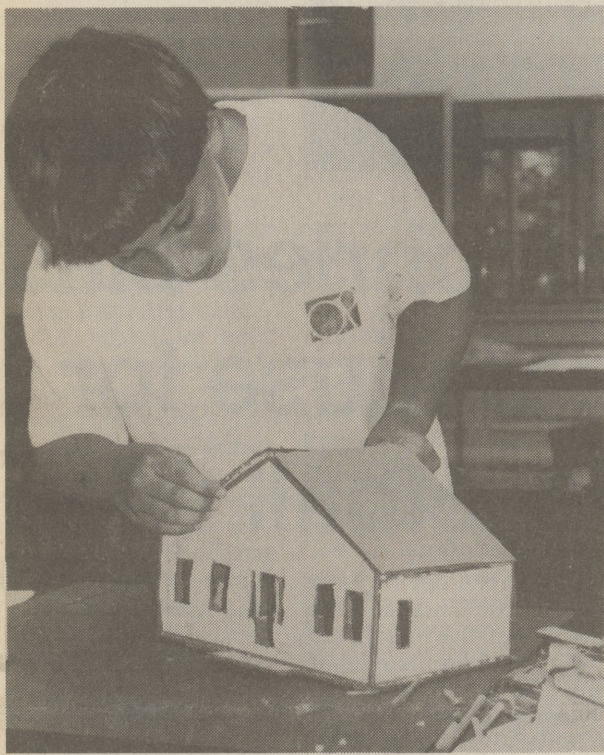
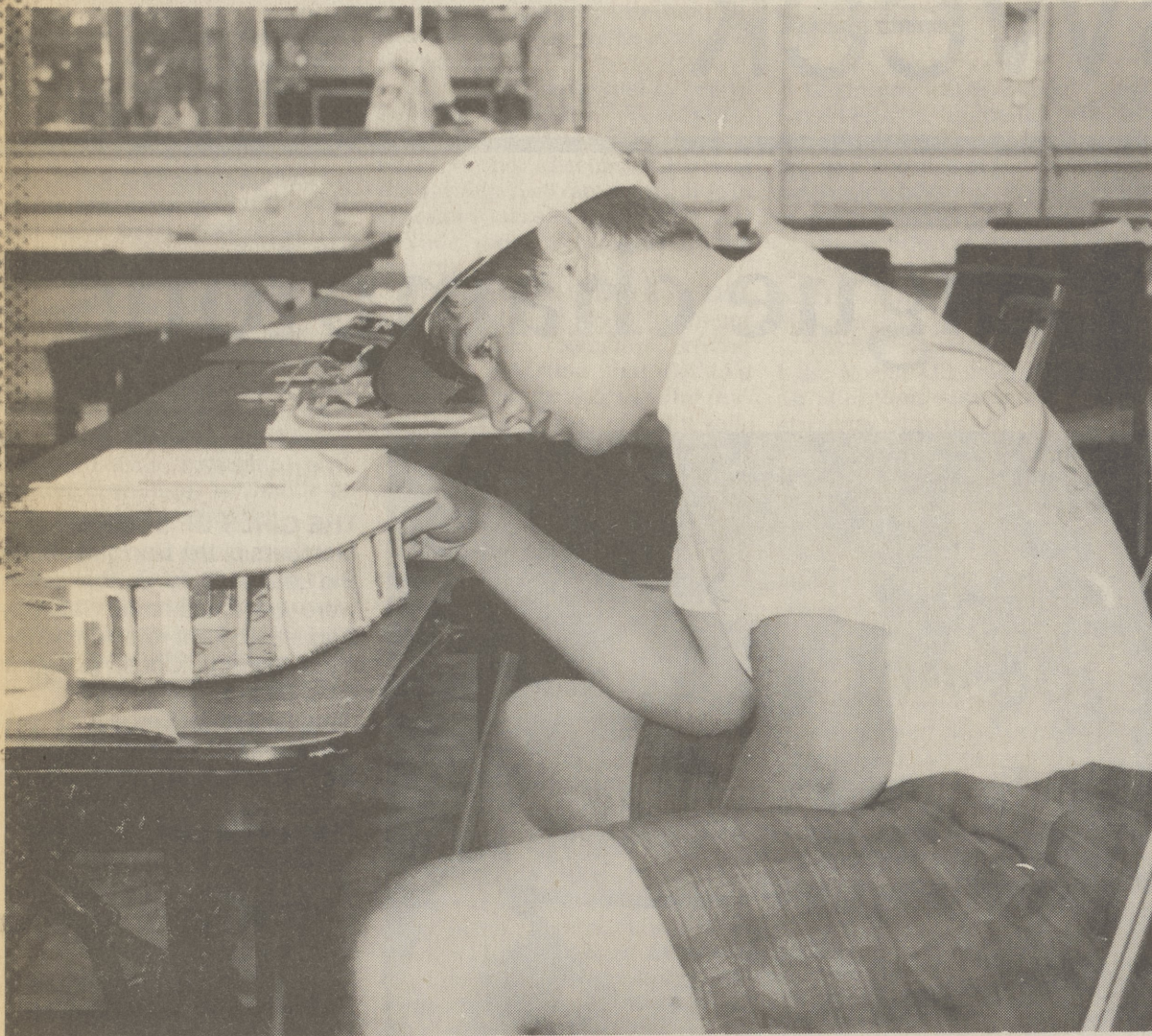


Designing a future in architecture

As Wyoming Seminary draws closer to its sesquicentennial celebration in 1994, President H. Jeremy Packard, announced that the opening of the 149th academic year will take place on Tuesday, Sept. 8 for students at the Lower School in Forty Fort, and on Wednesday, Sept. 9, for students at the College Preparatory School in Kingston.

D. Allan Woodard, dean of the Lower School, there will be an orientation for new middle school students, grades five through eight from 1 to 2 p.m. on September 4. Regular classes will begin at 8:30 a.m. on September 8.

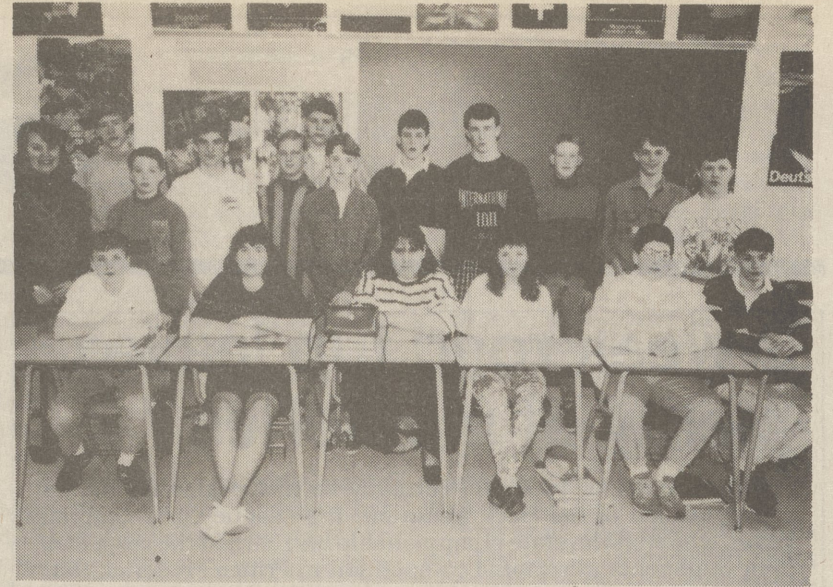
The registration schedule for students at the Upper School is as follows:

On Friday, Sept. 4, there will be a meeting of all new day students and their parents from 9 to 10 a.m. in the Buckingham Performing Arts Center, Sprague Avenue. This will be followed by an activities fair in the Pettebone-Dickson Student Center. At 11 a.m., new day students and their parents whose last names begin with A-L will register in the Stettler Learning Resources Center, Sprague Avenue, followed by brunch in Fleck Hall. Students and parents whose last names begin with M-Z will be served brunch at this time, and will follow with registration. At 12:45 p.m. all new day students will be tested in the S.L.R.C.

From 1:30 until 2:30 p.m., registration for returning day students whose last names begin with the letters A-L will take place in the S.L.R.C. Students whose names begin with the letters M-Z will register from 2:30 until 3:30 p.m.

Orientation activities for all new day students will take place from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. in the Carpenter Athletic Center. Casual attire is suggested and attendance by all new students is required. Changing facilities will be available.

There will be a special opening day convocation for the Seminary community held at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 9 in the Buckingham Performing Arts Center. Convocation speaker will be Herbert Quick, chairman of the foreign language department. The dress code will be in effect that day. Skirts or dresses are required for girls, while boys must wear a sportcoat and tie.
