



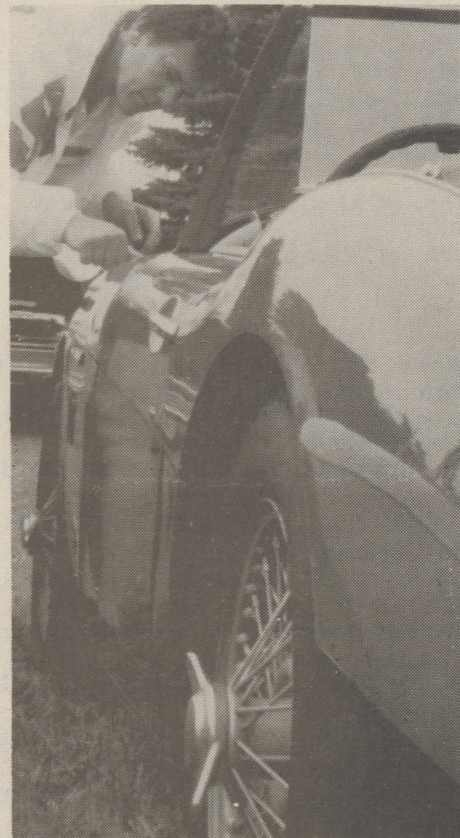
Harveys Lake cleanup day

Volunteers want to improve Dallas Rec Center

A summer haven for more than 200 Back Mountain kids, the Dallas Borough Recreation Center on Burndale Ave. has found some new friends.

Three Dallas Borough council members and a group of citizen volunteers have formed a new committee to raise money for several major playground improvements at the center.

Council members Marie Eyet, Martha Weber and Jay Pope saw the need for improvements and equipment and organized the committee, realizing that the borough cannot afford these projects on its own.

Other committee members in-

clude Mary Epley, Karen Arnaud, Ann Marie Schectman, Andrea DeAngelo and Barbara Liparella.

Proposed improvements include:

- Refurbishing the basketball courts on the park's lower end.
- Upgrading the old volleyball courts.
- Adding another basketball court on the park's upper end.
- Creating a parking area in a vacant lot on the park's lower end.
- Adding more sets of parallel bars, monkey bars and swings.

According to Marie Eyet, the first priorities are resurfacing the basketball court and creating a combination basketball-volleyball court with adjustable nets on the old skating rink, giving younger

children a place to play while the teen and adult leagues are playing.

"We have been given an estimate of approximately \$7,000 for this phase of the project," Mrs. Eyet said. "A state grant for materials is available, so that the borough would be responsible only for labor costs. We hope to raise \$3,500, with the state picking up the rest of the tab."

Mrs. Eyet said that any leftover funds will be used for the other improvements.

The first fund-raiser, an "All You Can Eat" barbecue dinner, is scheduled for Sunday, September 13, at the Dallas Middle School. Tickets are \$7 for adults and \$4.50 for children and are available at "The Field House" sporting goods

store and from rec center personnel and parents.

The committee also has organized a raffle; Mrs. Eyet expects tickets to be available beginning Thursday, August 20, from committee members, rec center personnel and parents.

Mrs. Eyet commended three volunteers from the community, Jennie Thomas, Robin Lorenzi and Janet Shaskas, who have worked very hard doing publicity for the committee.
