

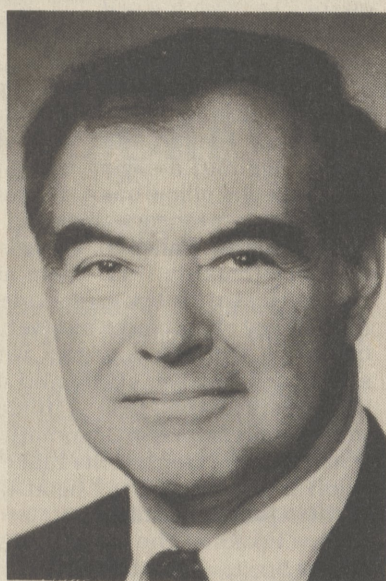
Bernard Banks will lead Boy Scout Council
