Florida school adopted by Dallas schools

The Dallas School District will adopt the Beuna Vista School in Miami as a part of the Adopt-a-School program for schools damaged during August's Hurricane Andrew.

The school district got word of the school which they will be assisting on September 17.

"The school is a kindergarten through second grade school with 530 students and is located on the fringe of Miami," Gil Griffiths, Dallas Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction said.

The students at the school are mostly minority students with 80 percent of the students using

English as a second language, Griffiths said.

Buena Vista is located in the Winwood section of Miami, and according to the school's principal Patrick Doyle, the area is a Puerto Rican neighborhood.

"The school's population is 63 percent hispanic and 36 percent black. Winwood is a poor neighborhood and our students are in need of everything," according to Doyle.

Doyle added that the majority of the students are on the school's free meal program.

Doyle said that Dallas Elementary will provide school supplies for the students. In addition, the school will provide gift certificates so the students can purchase socks and underwear Griffiths said.

"Buena Vista will get the additional items because the students need them and the school was not hit as hard as other schools in Miami," Griffiths said.

"With the exception of a few blown out windows, the school building sustained minor damage," Doyle said. The hurricane delayed the opening of the school for about two weeks.

"Teachers were not called to report back immediately because janitors had to clean the school," Doyle said.

Doyle said that the students have not been informed of the assistance because it may be over a week before the items arrive. He said that some of the parents have been informed and they are pleased with the effort.

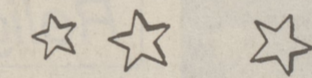

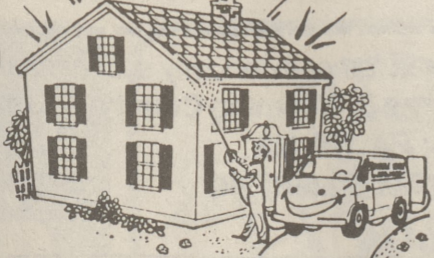
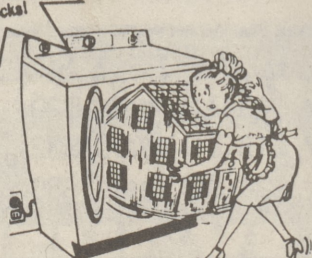
