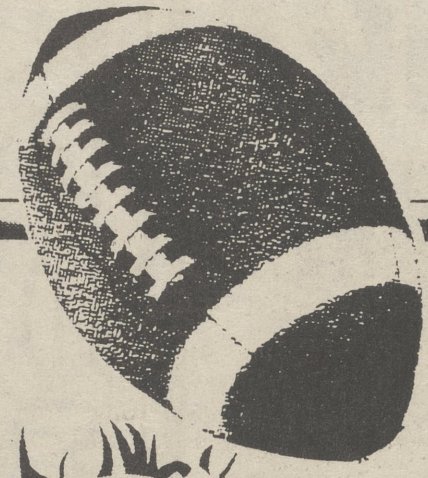
RAELYN KIOSKE MAJOR

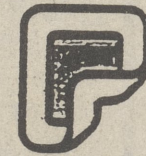

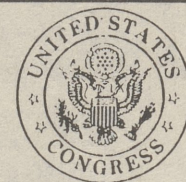
