Spencer retires as executive director of Heritage House

Margaret R. Spencer, executive director of Heritage House, Wilkes-Barre has announced her retirement effective October 1, 1992.

Mrs. Spencer, a pioneer in the field of aging, became an activist for the elderly in 1964 and her name has appeared repeatedly since that time in connection with Pennsylvania's efforts to establish community services for the aged.

Since 1977, Spencer has carried out various duties as executive director including administrative, operational, personnel, financial and civic responsibilities.

Prior to her employment at Heritage House, Spencer served as executive director of the Pennsylvania Association of Older Persons in Harrisburg; executive director of the Luzerne/Wyoming Counties Bureau for the Aging; executive director of the Luzerne County Bureau for the Aging and director of the Day Care Center at Valley Crest Nursing Home.

Spencer established the Bureau for the Aging in 1968 and served as its executive director in 1972 when effects of Hurricane Agnes devastated the area. In response to the desperate needs of area residents, she was responsible for directing and overseeing the flood recovery effort for the elderly. Over 6,000 older persons were left homeless as a result of Agnes' destruction and the Bureau for the Aging was called upon to provide social services and obtain housing for these persons. For her successful efforts on behalf of the Bureau, Spencer received a commendation from Frank Carlucci, President Nixon's personal representative.

She is the author of several articles published in gerontological publications and is the recipient of various awards, including "Outstanding Woman of the Year" from the West Side Business and Professional Women; "Distinguished Service Award" from Fos-

ter Grandparents of Luzerne County; "Distinguished Service Award," from the Pennsylvania Association of Non-profit Homes for the Aging; "Community Service Award," from the Luzerne/Wyoming Counties Bureau for the Aging; "Meritorious Service Award," from the American Association of Homes for the Aging; "Public Relations Award," from the Pennsylvania Association of Non-Profit Homes for the Aging; "Outstand-

ing Achievements and Service Award," from the Pennsylvania Council on Aging; and the "Outstanding and Dedicated Service Award," from the Northeast Pennsylvania Chapter of the Pennsylvania Association of Non-Profit Homes for the Aging (NOR-PANPHA).

She is currently vice-chairman of the board of Derma Sciences, Old Forge; member of the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Association of Non-Profit Homes for the Aging; Past President of NOR-PANPHA; member of the American Association of Homes for the Aging, the American College of Health Care Administra-tors, Alpha Delta Mu-National Honor Society of Social Work, board of directors of Heritage House, Diversified Medical Systems, General Medical Services and the Home for Homeless Women. She is also a member of the governing council of the American Hospital Association's Section for Aging and Long-Term Care Services.

In addition to her work as s consultant to agencies, counties and states in assisting them to develop programs for older persons, Spencer has also served as a guest lecturer for various colleges throughout the state.

She resides in Dallas with her husband, L. Robert. They have a daughter, Mrs. John T. (Kelly) Bothwick and two grandsons, Jonathan and Christopher.

PARDINI COMPLETES BASIC TRAINING


Army Reserve Pvt. Jeremy R. Pardini has completed basic training.
