Mehlochick helped his battalion compose the ground combat element for the 37th Marine Expeditionary Unit throughout the exercise.

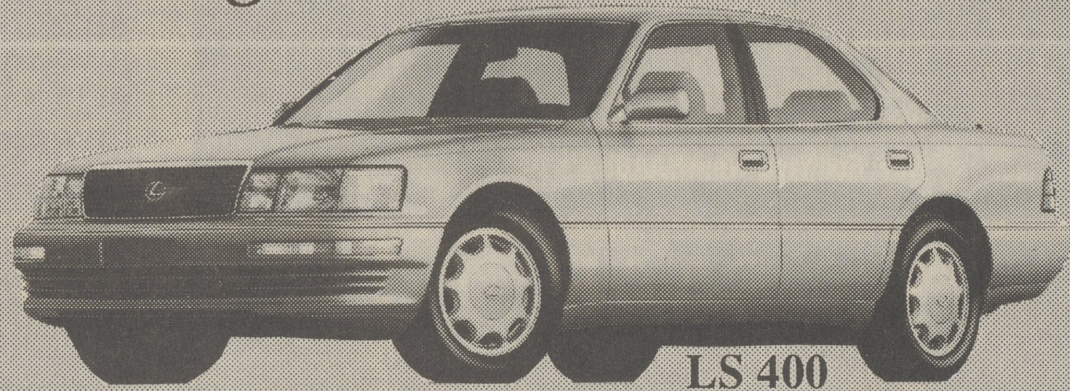
The 1988 graduate of Dallas Senior High School, Dallas, joined the Marine Corps in October 1988.
