Sport card show at Westmoreland

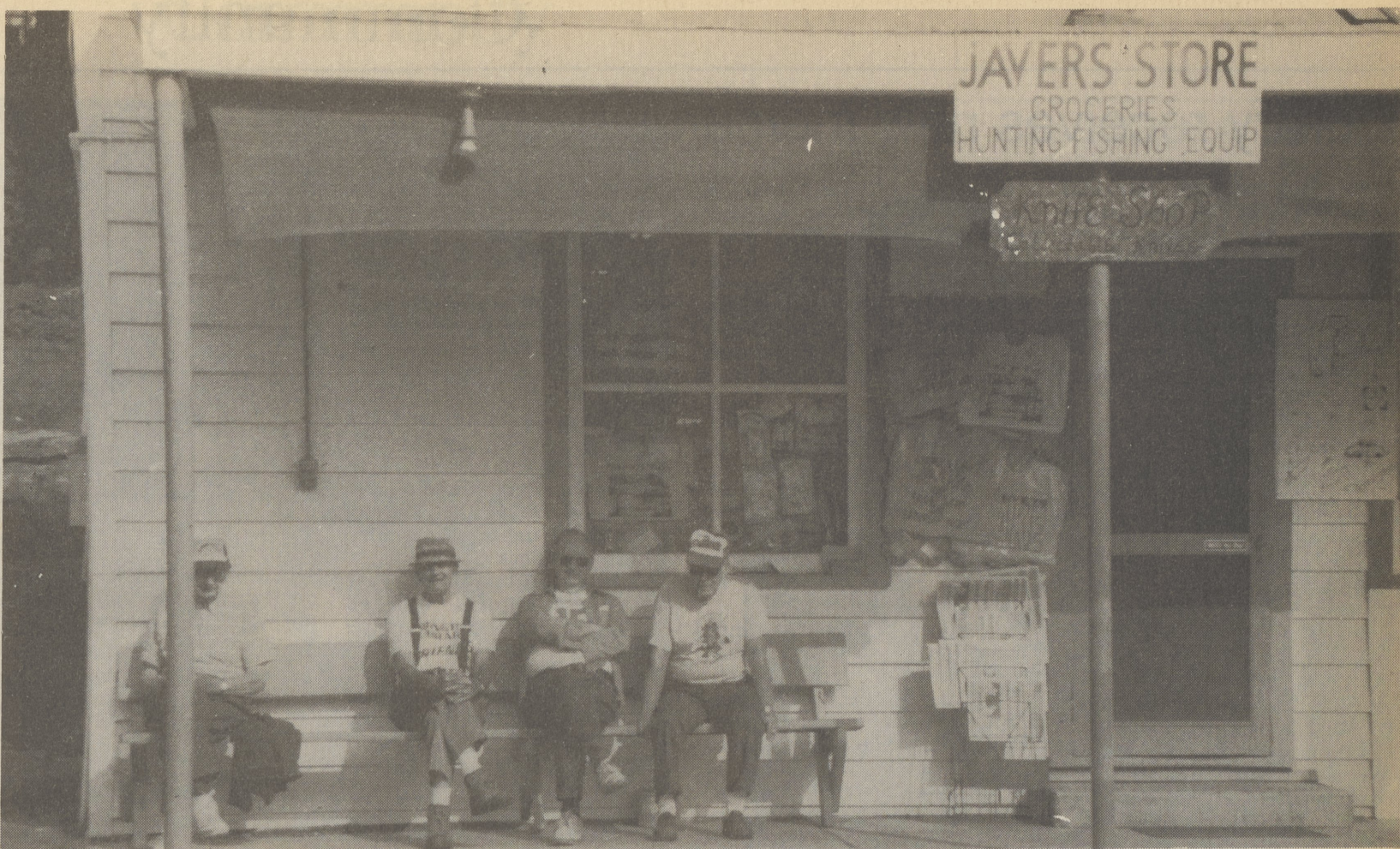

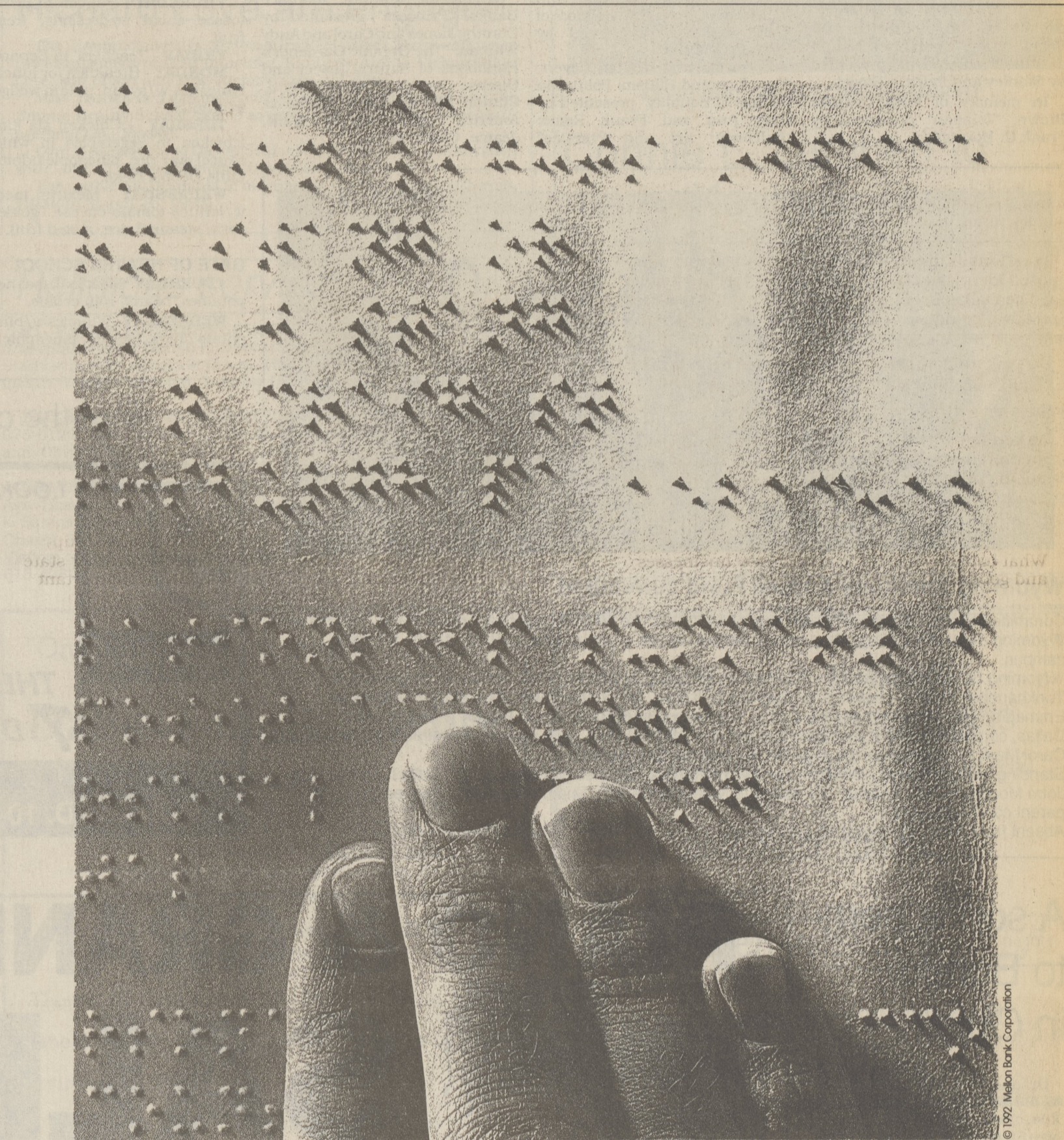
