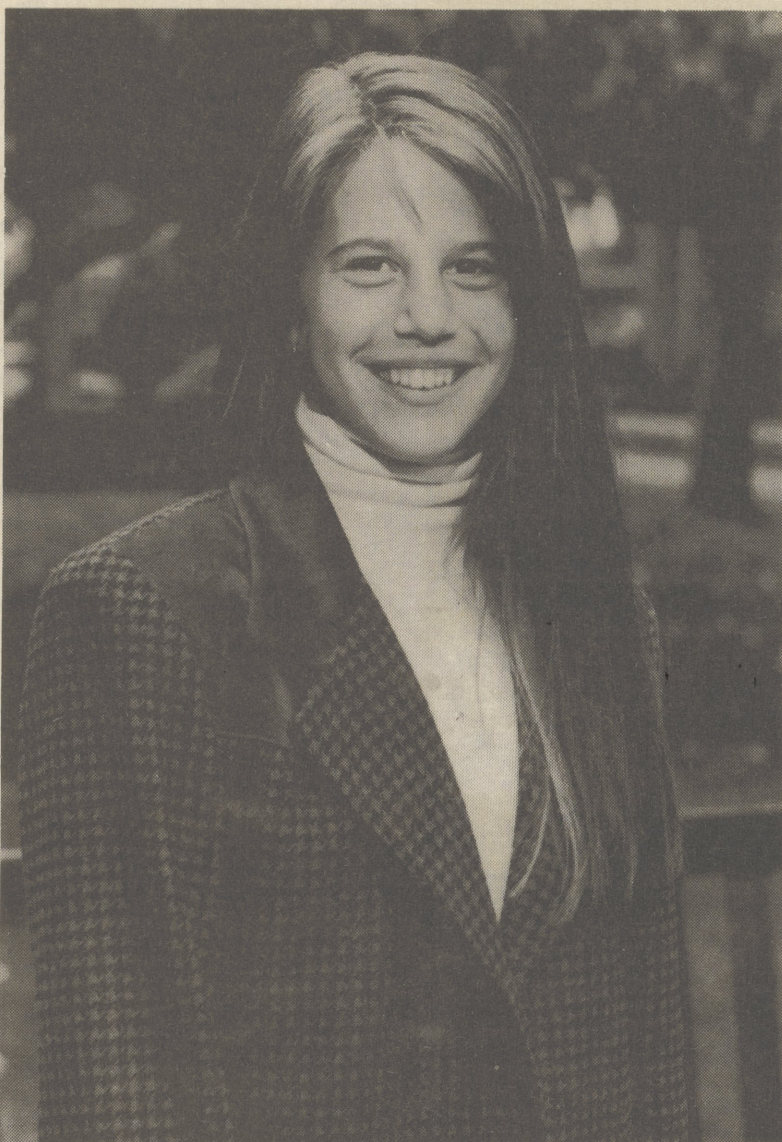
This year's field show music is "Colovetsian Dances," a ballet which occurs in the opera "Prince Igor" by Alexander Borodin.
