'Oklahoma' at Bishop O'Reilly

Bishop O'Reilly High School, Kingston, will present Rogers and Hammerstein's "Oklahoma" on Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 7 and 8 in the school auditorium.

Curtain time for each performance is 8 p.m. Tickets will be available at the door. The musical, based on Lynn Riggs' Play "Green Grow the Lilacs," premiered at the St. James Theatre in New York City on March 31, 1943 and enjoyed a subsequent Broadway run of more than five years, amassing a total of 2,212 performances. The play was awarded a special Pulitzer Prize for Drama in 1944.

The show includes many memorable songs which have become a part of popular culture, including "Oh, What a Beautiful Mornin'," "The Surrey With the Fringe on Top," "People Will Say We're in Love," and "Oklahoma." Set in Indian territory just after the turn of the century, the play revolves around the love story of the two lead characters, Laurie and Curly.

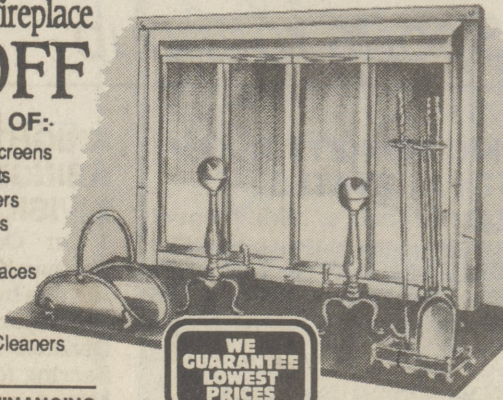

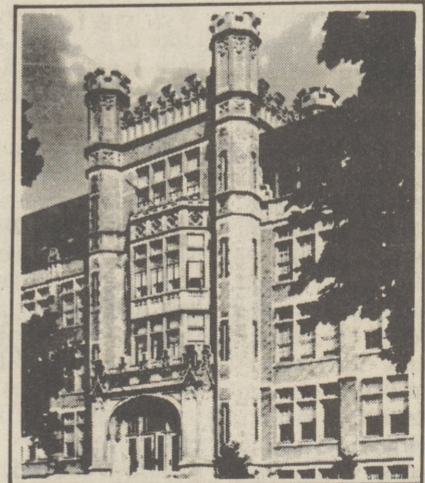
