

Decision to be made on water rates settlement

No decision has been reached concerning a tentative settlement between the Dallas Shavertown, Harveys Lake, Water Companies and the state public utilities commission. The company is still awaiting a decision from an administrative law judge in Harrisburg.

"My understanding is that a settlement in the water rates issue has been presented to the judge and we are awaiting his decision," water company manager Mike Coyle said.

A proposed rate increase will affect customers in Dallas, Shavertown Harveys Lake and Noxen. Coyle said that he has yet to learn what the proposed settlement will mean to the water company's customers.

"There has been no timetable set for when the judge will make his decision. The settlement was reached before the scheduled second set of evidentiary hearings between the water company and the PUC.

The hearings were to be a continuation of the process of reviewing the proposed rate increases, Coyle said.
