TWO CARS COLLIDE ON ROUTE 309

According to Kingston Township police, a 1986 Plymouth Voyager operated by Antoinette Mary Kravits, 55, of RR 6 Dallas, and a 1984 Dodge Maxi operated by William F. Ivey III, 36, of RR 2 Meshoppen, were involved in an accident Wednesday, November 25, on Route 309. Police said that the Kravits vehicle, traveling north on Route 309, struck the Ivey vehicle, traveling south, after swerving across the highway. Both vehicles sustained severe damage and were towed from the scene, according to the report. The Kingston Township ambulance, Kingston Township rescue unit and Medic I assisted at the scene, police said.

the accident.

ONE-CAR ACCIDENT ON MANOR DRIVE

According to Kingston Township police, a 1988 Nissan Pulsar operated by Barbara J. Nekrasz, 44, of Trucksville, was involved in a one-car accident Sunday, November 29, on Manor Road. Police said that the Nekrasz vehicle, which had been traveling north on Manor Road, left the roadway for an unknown reason, striking a plastic underground gas line marker, coming to rest against a tree. Police found no skid marks on the roadway, according to the report. The vehicle sustained severe damage and was towed from the scene. The driver was unable to give police a statement due to her injuries, police said.
