Through close-up portraits of girls engaged in a variety of Girl Scout activities, the boxes depict the supportive, "girls-only" environment in which girls practice new skills, establish lasting friend-

ships, learn from positive female role models and have fun. National studies have shown that a single-sex setting helps girls develop the self-esteem and confidence needed to grow into resourceful, happy citizens.

The boxes were designed by acclaimed graphic designer Saul Bass, of Bass/Yager & Associates, Los Angeles, California. The award-winning Bass, whose designs include logos for such major corporations as AT&T, Exxon, and United Airlines, also created the Girl Scout service mark in 1978.

'A Christmas Carol' at Historical Society

The Wyoming Historical and Geological Society announces the fourth holiday appearance of Joe Plummer in a concert reading of Charles Dickens' immortal classic, "A Christmas Carol," Friday, Dec. 18 at 8 p.m.

As in years past, Plummer's performance will take place on the second floor of the First United Methodist Church, 47 North Franklin St., Wilkes-Barre. The reading was originally held in the Historical Society Museum, but was moved to the church to accommodate an overflow audience.

Plummer plays all 37 parts in "A

Christmas Carol"—from Scrooge to Tiny Tim. His text is an edited version of the script Dickens used on his reading tour of England and America during the 1850's.

Critics have hailed the one-man tour de force, calling it "incandescent," and "the perfect accompaniment to any Christmas celebration."

Plummer is an assistant professor of Mass Communications at King's College. His season performances of Dickens' work began during the 1960's and have taken him to Ohio, Massachusetts, New York and the District of Columbia.

Plummer shared his interest with students at King's College this summer in a course entitled "What the Dickens?"

"A Christmas Carol" is being sponsored in part by the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts and the City of Wilkes-Barre. Tickets are available for purchase at the Wyoming Historical and Geological Society, 49 South Franklin St., Wilkes-Barre.
