The MacDonald Art Gallery at College Misericordia will present the photographs of Alexandre Silva, through Sunday, Jan. 31.


This exhibit includes 25 black and white photographs featuring Silva's personal style of blending realism and abstraction. "The act of taking a photograph is in itself an act of moving into the surreal," explained Silva. "A photographer needs to become more involved in the physical process of creating a photograph rather than just exposing light sensitive film."

A former Misericordia faculty member, Silva is currently a photographer in Scranton and an assistant professor at Marywood College where he developed the photography and computer graphics program.

According to Brian Benedetti, Gallery director, each of Silva's photographs is an original. "The photographic images of Alex Silva reflect creativity and inventiveness," he explained. "The use of abstraction, realism and surreal-like images are unique to Mr. Silva's personal style.'

Silva is a member of the National Association for Photographic Art, the Society for Photographic Education and Pi Lambda Theta, the National Honor and Professional Association.
