Dallas Middle School principal pleads innocent to harassment

According to a spokesman for District Magistrate Earl Gregory's office, Dallas Middle School principal Anthony Martinelli has pleaded not guilty to charges of harassment.

A hearing date has not been set.

The charges were filed by Howard and Debbie Jones of Dallas Township, who claim that on Friday, January 8, their 14-year-old son sustained bruises

and abrasions to the left side of his chest after Martinelli grabbed him and pushed him down into his seat while the boy was leaning over a cafeteria table to accept a slice of pizza from a friend.

After the incident became publicized, forty middle school teachers and two secretaries signed an open letter in support of Martinelli.
