JCC to host Holocaust survivor March 29

The Jewish Community Center of Wyoming Valley is pleased to announce a visit by Solomon Perel, the hero behind the award winning movie "Europa, Europa". The movie is the fascinating story of Solomon Perel, a German Jewish teenager who survived the horrors of World War II under the disguise of a pure Aryan Nazi.

Fleeing the town of Lodz, Poland and driven by his wits and courage, Solomon managed to escape the bitter end of his family through a series of adventures in Poland, Russia and Germany. Among others, he spent two years of his life in a Soviet orphanage where he became an ardent Communist preaching for reforms. He was later captured by the Nazis who mistook him for an Aryan and therefore recruited him to the "Wehrmacht", the Nazi military. The peak of his drama happens in the prestigious Hitler Youth Academy where Perel was sent for two years of training. This is a movie masterpiece about the tragedy of the Holocaust through the true story of one young man who must hide his identity in order to survive.

This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to hear this story of this brave young man, now 66 years old and living in Israel. For 40 years, Solomon Perel says, he was unable to speak about his extraordinary gambit to survive the Second World War, how he disguised his Jewish identity, passed himself off as an ethnic German and joined the paramilitary ranks of the Hitler Youth. He wouldn't even discuss it with his sons while living what passed for an ordinary

Jewish life in Israel.

The film has been the subject of both critical acclaim and bitter controversy in Europe and the U.S. It has been relatively easy, Perel says, to explain himself in countless interviews...that is because Solomon Perel's double life, as a Jew and as a Jew-hating Nazi, is one he says he was never entirely able to give up.

Perel will speak at the Jewish Community Center on Monday, March 29 at 7:30 p.m. in the Weiss Auditorium. View the movie at 5 p.m. that evening. There is no admission charge.
