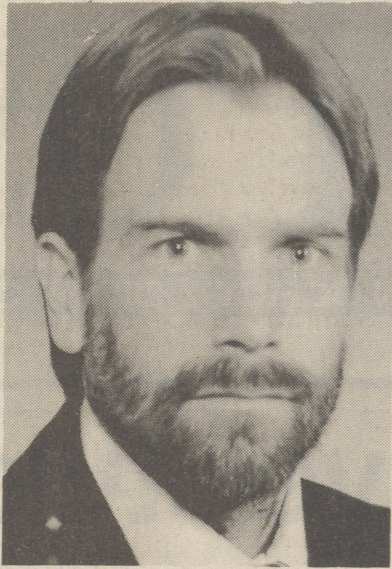


Samuel Rhodes to run for Lake-Lehman school board

Kingston Twp. lists political sign rules

All political candidates who plan to post signs in Kingston Township are reminded that signs can be posted no earlier than 30 days prior to any election and must be removed no later than 30 days after the election.

Campaign signs cannot exceed four square feet in size and signs cannot be attached to fences, trees, or utility poles.

A bond in the amount of \$100

must be deposited with Kingston Township prior to issuance of a sign permit and the posting of any sign. The bond will be returned if all signs are removed within 30 days after the election.

A permit to post political signs can be obtained from the Township Zoning Office, 11 Carverton Road, Trucksville. Questions may be directed to the Zoning Officer at 696-3809.
