

## Spring cleanups

Several Back Mountain communities have announced their spring cleanup schedules. The dates and procedures are listed below. All require proof of residency.

### Dallas Borough

**WHEN:** May 10-15, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday.  
**WHERE:** Borough garage, behind the borough building, 25 Main Street.  
**WHAT:** Household items including appliances. Freon must be removed from refrigerators and air conditioners.

**NOT ACCEPTED:** Yard waste, toxic materials, asbestos, construction debris, paint in cans, sealed containers, batteries, ashes.  
**CHARGES:** \$5 each for "white goods" appliances. \$2 each for mattresses and tires off the rims.

**INFORMATION:** Call 675-1389 weekdays between 8 a.m. and Noon.

### Dallas Township

**WHEN:** May 10-15, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday.  
**WHERE:** Rear of Dallas Township building, Route 309.  
**WHAT:** Household items including appliances. Only 2 tires per household.

**NOT ACCEPTED:** Hazardous waste, chemicals, brush, tree stumps, cinder block, animal or human waste, construction materials, leaves, grass, garbage, newspapers.

**CHARGES:** Cars, no charge. Pickup load, 8' box, \$20; Pickup load, 10' box, \$15; Mini pickup, \$15; Tag-a-long trailer load, \$20; Larger trucks according to size. Also, there will be a service charge for large items such as carpets, couches and other furniture and appliances.

### Kingston Township

**WHEN:** May 10-15, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday.  
**WHERE:** Kingston Twp. maintenance building, 225 East Center Street, Shavertown.

**WHAT:** Household items. Limit of 2 tires per household.  
**NOT ACCEPTED:** Washers, dryers, refrigerators, air conditioners, hot water heaters, recyclable materials, tree stumps, brick, stone, concrete, construction debris, commercial waste, paint, chemicals and other materials as prohibited by law.

**CHARGES:** Cars, vans and station wagons no charge. Residents with pickup trucks and larger vehicles must obtain an admission coupon at the township office before entering the cleanup site. Vehicles larger than a pickup truck, \$25. All vehicles with commercial licenses must have an admission coupon. Coupons available at the Kingston Township Municipal Building Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

## KT residents must have permits for construction

The residents or anyone locating in Kingston Township are reminded that the Zoning Ordinance requires that a Zoning Permit be issued for the following residential and non-residential activities:

The use of land, the use of buildings or the construction, enlargement, extension or modification of all buildings, accessory buildings, garages, decks, sheds, patios, fences, retaining walls, swimming pools, off street parking facilities, driveways or other

projections into the yard space. Also, the demolition of a structure and a home occupation require permits.

In addition, a building permit is required for all new construction, including accessory buildings and enlargement, or exterior modification of existing buildings.

Permits or additional information may be obtained from the Zoning Officer, in the Municipal Office at 11 Carverton Road, Trucksville, daily from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
