Your health insurance company may not reimburse us for certain services we provide on an ambulance call. As a subscriber you will not be billed any additional charges. But, if you choose not to subscribe, you will be billed directly.

In summary, whenever a subscriber uses our ambulance, a bill is submitted to their insurance comany. If the insurance company reimburses any portion of the bill, it is accepted as payment in full by our ambulance service. However, if the insurance company denies a claim for any reason, the subscriber is not charged

anything further.

On the other hand, if a nonsubscriber uses the ambulance, he is billed directly for services (except Medicare and Medical Assistance) and is responsible for the total invoiced amount.


