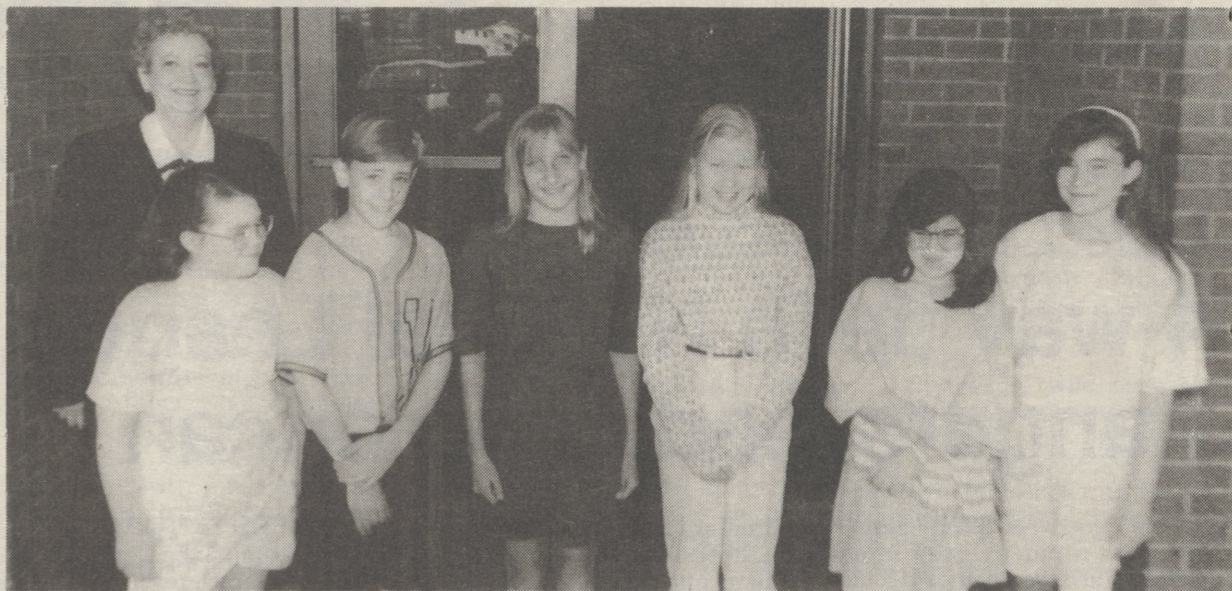
## Dallas fifth graders' poetry will be published
