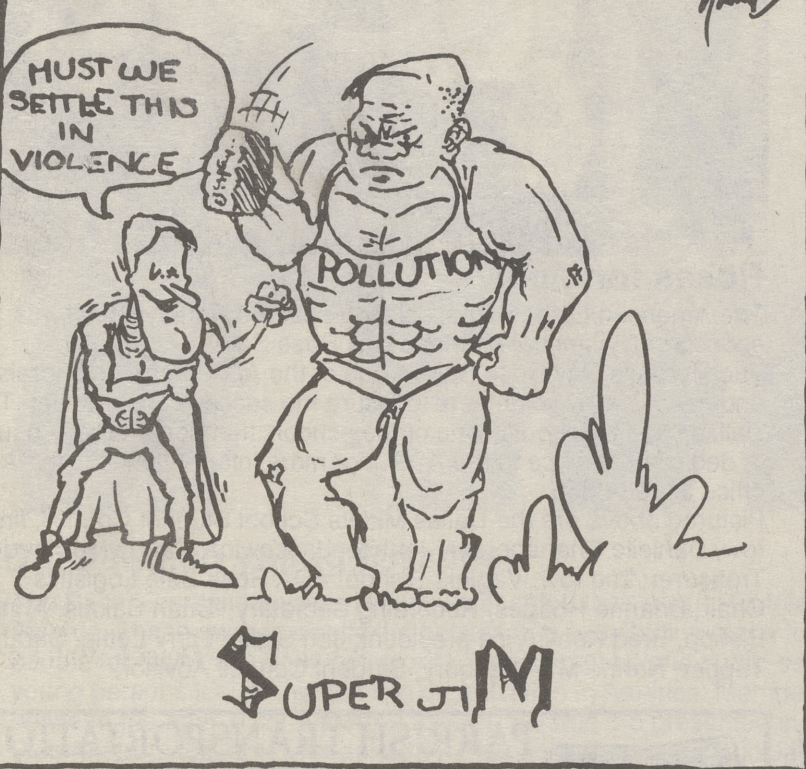

Ross Twp. students travel around the world with books

Ross Elementary School of the Lake-Lehman School District went on an imaginary airplane ride via Ross Airlines, Reading Around the World, with tour guide, Mrs. Nancy Walters, Chapter I reading teacher and Reading Is Fundamental (RIF) coordinator. This two day reading program was designed to stimulate cultural awareness and promote an understanding of our multicultural heritage across the elementary and secondary curriculum.

On Wednesday, March 24, Mrs. Jean Lipski's Humanities II class of 42 sophomores prepared and served desserts to 130 Ross students. Each student tasted a dessert from each of the five hosted countries: Australia, Mexico, Canada, Germany, and Poland.

On Thursday, March 25, during an assembly program, the

students traveled from country to country using a world map. Each classroom hosted a particular country. When we arrived at a selected country, the classroom demonstrated a project for the audience.

Lake-Lehman High School honor students were selected as readers in the classrooms based on their travel experiences to other countries. Three foreign exchange students also read in class.

After the high school students read, the elementary students chose a book to keep and read. A book report was assigned according to grade level. When the book report was returned to school and approved, the student received a prize. They all enjoyed an animated video entitled, "Around the World in 80 Days."

American Host families are being sought for high school students from Western and Eastern Europe, Asia, South America and Australia for the 1993-94 school year in a program sponsored by the American Intercultural Student Exchange (AISE).

These exceptional students, ages 15 through 18 will arrive in the United States in August, 1993, attend a local high school, and

return to their home countries in June of 1994. The students, all fluent in English, have been carefully screened by the local representatives in their home countries, and have their own medical insurance and spending money.

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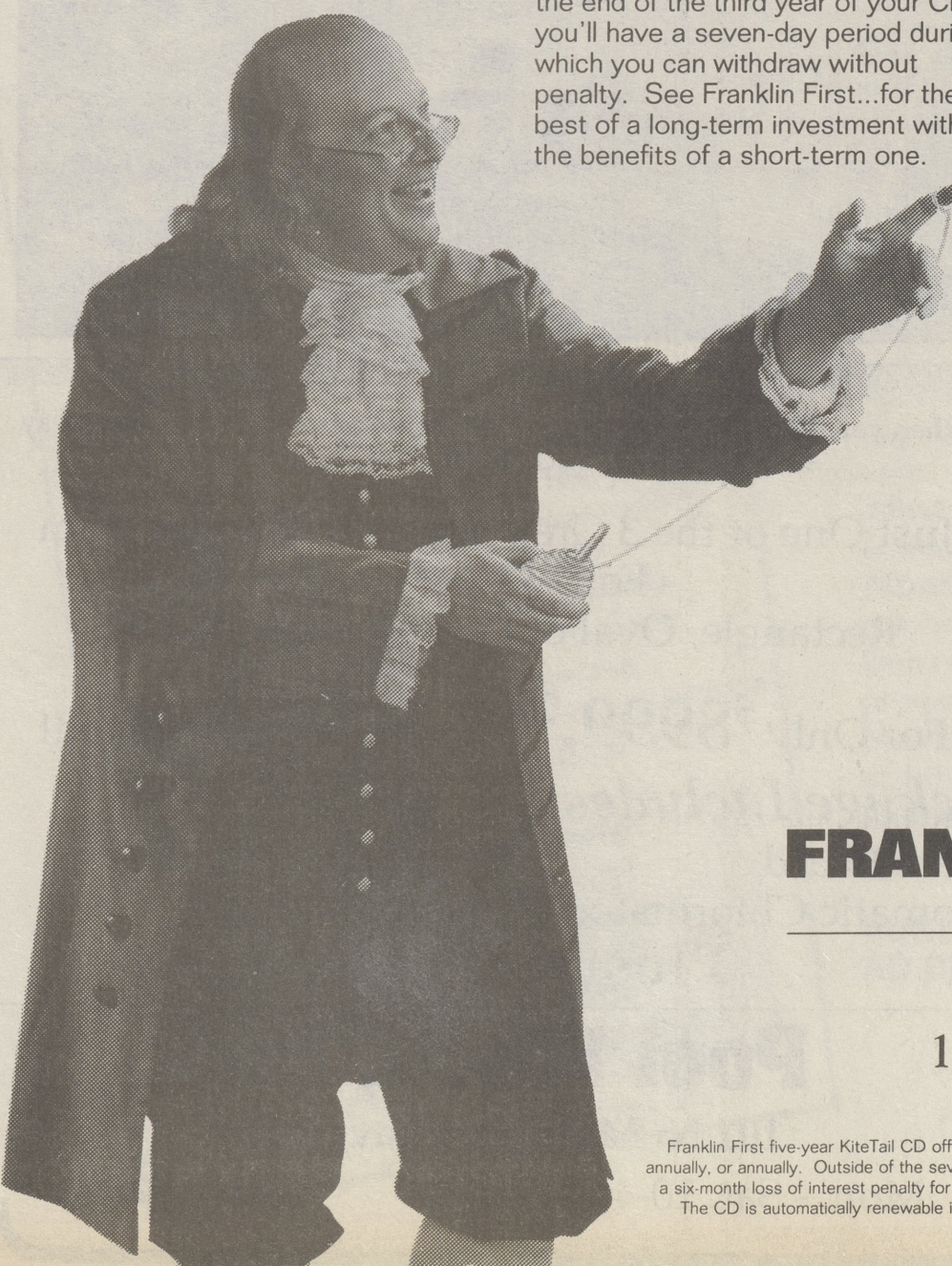
