

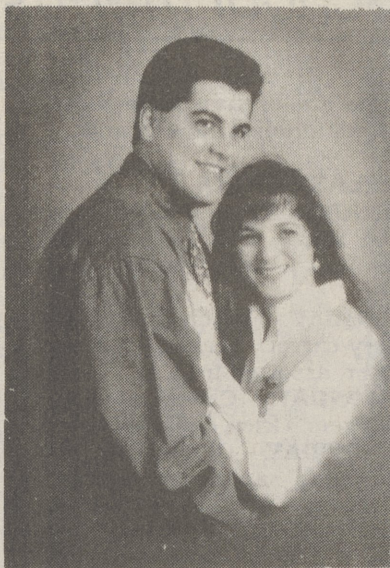
## Meg Gorgone will marry Lyle Pitner in July
