



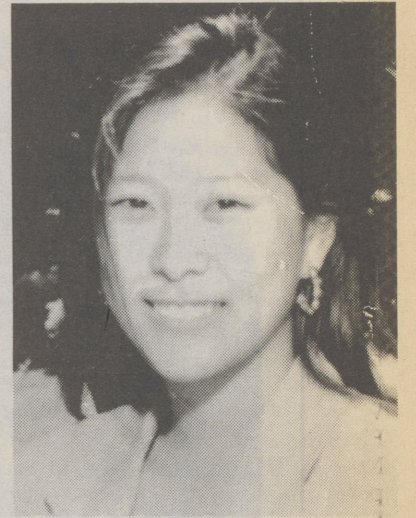

Park is the son of Dr. and Mrs. Kie J. Park, Mountaintop. He was selected to attend the Pennsylvania Governor's School for the Arts at Mercyhurst College in Erie.

Six-hundred fifty students were chosen from the thousands of candidates statewide to participate in the six schools. The competition is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

The Pennsylvania Governor's Schools are full-scholarship, residential summer programs for gifted or talented students. Scholars who successfully complete the program are eligible for special merit scholarships offered by many of Pennsylvania's private and state colleges and universities.
