The Wyoming Historical & Geological Society will hold its 16th Annual Auction on Saturday, August 7, at the Swetland Homestead on Wyoming Avenue in Wyoming.

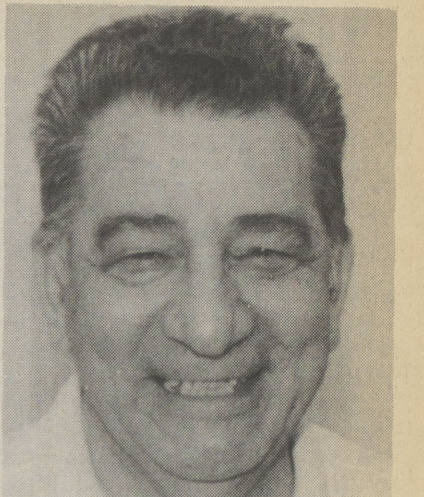

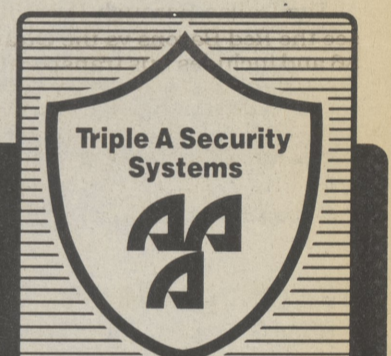
Prior to Offset Paperback, Lou worked at Nelson Manufacturing Company in Wyoming, Pa.

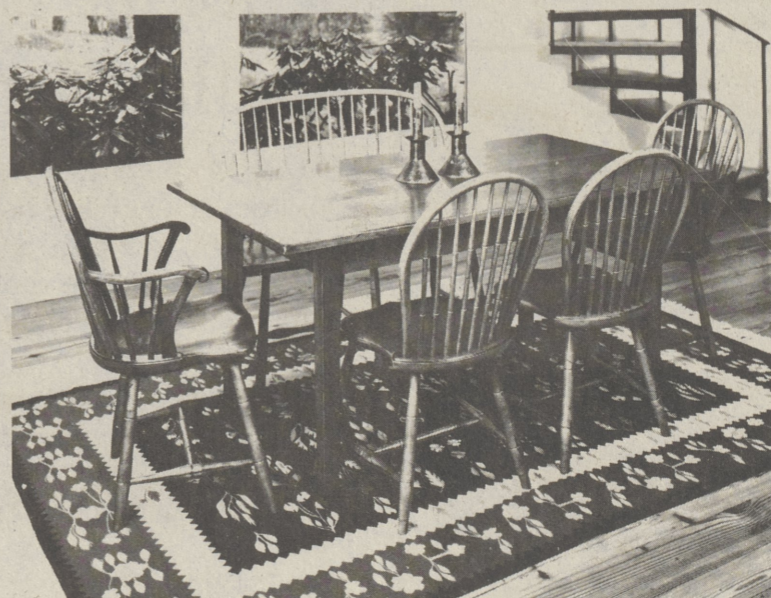
