The 62nd Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association returns to Wilkes-Barre when it convenes here Septemer 2-5. Saturday's daytime activities will be a repeat of the seminars, workshops and tours. The annual meeting of WNGGA is in the morning, followed by a Public Square ceremony, the WAY luncheon and a traditional Awr Y Plant. A spectacular concert is planned for Saturday evening at the Irem Temple Mosque which is also the site of the Sunday morning bilingual worship service.
