## Welsh Festival returns to area Sept. 2-5

The 62nd Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association returns to Wilkes-Barre when it convenes here Sept. 2-5. It was 10 years ago that the NWGGA selected Wilkes-Barre for the first time to sponsor the 52nd National. The result was the largest gathering in the 52-year history of the NWGGA which brought together 3,500 voices at the Sunday Gymanfa.

Headquarters for the National Welsh Festival will be the Ramada Hotel which is also the location of the Welsh Market Place.

General Chairman Jack Pritchard and Vice Chairman Beth Landmesser have arranged a weekend of events beginning Thursday evening at the F.M. Kirby Center with the Nosen Lawen and the Welsh Folk Music Concert.

Friday's daytime schedule includes seminars, workshops, children activities and tours of historical Wyoming Valley, our local Welsh churches and a Scranton deep coal mine. The evening banquet at Genetti's Best Western will feature keynote speaker Howard Stringer, President of CBS Broadcasting Group and a native of Cardiff, Wales.

Saturday's daytime activities will be a repeat of the seminars, workshops and tours. The annual meeting of WNGGA is in the morning, followed by a Public Square ceremony, the WAY luncheon and a traditional Awr Y Plant. A spectacular concert is planned for Saturday evening at the Irem Temple Mosque which is also the site of the Sunday morning bilingual worship service.

The grand finale of the four day festival will be Sunday's Gymanfa at the 109th Field Artillery Armory with both afternoon and evening sessions. Alun Guy, Cardiff, Wales, who was conductor at the 52nd W-B National, has accepted his invitation for a return engagement including organist Evan Gwyndaf Roberts.
