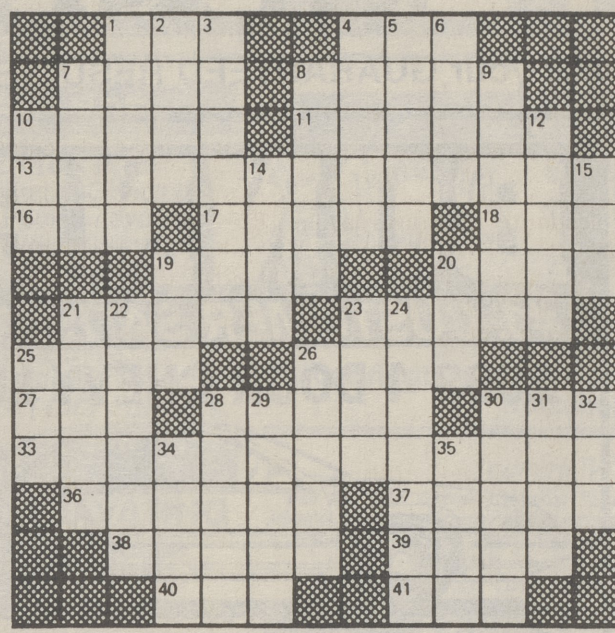
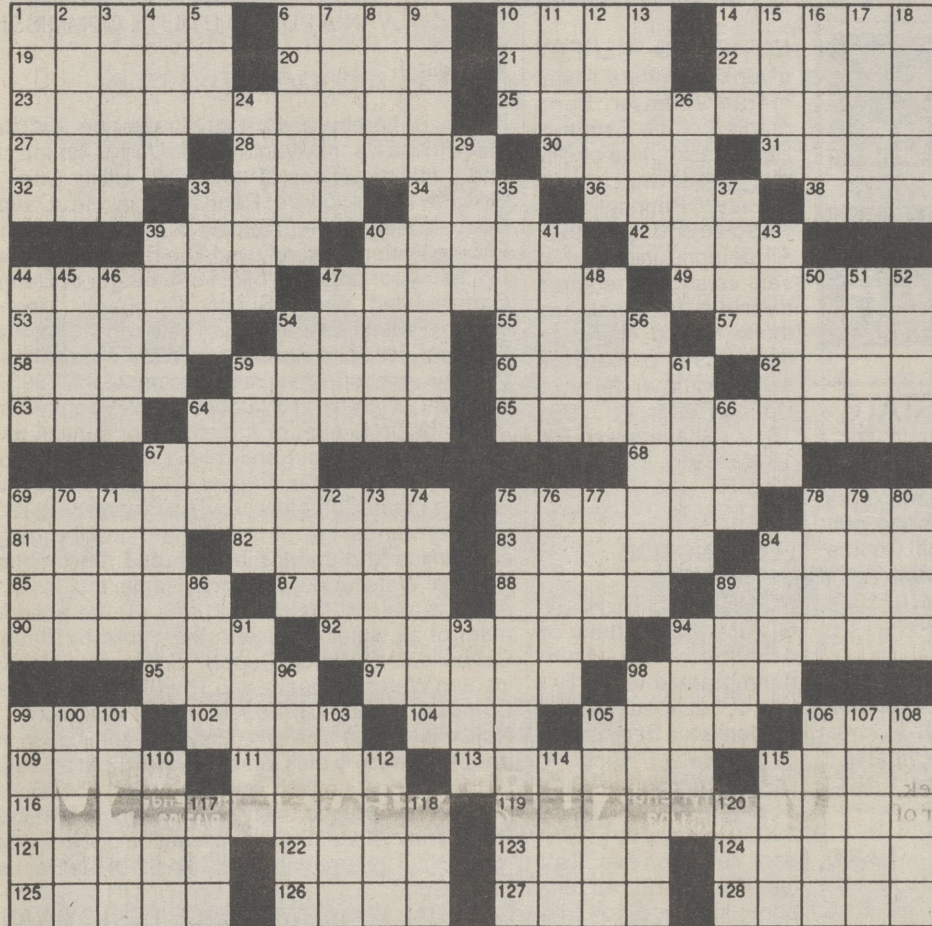

pay ten percent of the price, with DER picking up the rest of the tab.

When the borough buys the equipment, it will hold several information sessions to become familiar with the new program, Lutsey said.

He has requested that residents not begin raking their leaves into the gutters until the borough announces that the new equipment has arrived and is ready to go.

Funded by a \$2 per ton assessment at landfills and recycling centers, the grant program is operated by DER to help municipi-

palities develop waste disposal plans and recycling programs.

Because many landfills no longer accept leaves and state or local ordinances limit open burning, municipalities have begun to set up various types of composting programs in which homeowners' leaves are collected for composting. These programs also provide for homeowners and farmers to pick up leaves for garden mulch.

Grants cover up to 90 percent of the cost of equipment and site preparation, according to a recent DER news release

"The cornerstone to this facility is the Dallas Family Practice," explained Messersmith of the reason for placing the complex in the Back Mountain. "We're going to build space to accommodate eight family practitioners. We're hoping to have doctors time-share the office space with other specialists."

"We're going to offer treatment services such as physical therapy and occupational therapy," Messersmith added. "We're also going to have diagnostic services such as radiology and mammography. The whole move in the health care industry is to make

health care efficient, convenient and cost effective. People are also looking for an alternative to expensive in-patient care. We're hoping to offer that kind of care right here in the Back Mountain."

If everything goes according to plan, ground-breaking for the facility could take place in January of 1994. But Messersmith quickly added that he wouldn't be surprised if the ground-breaking took place in the spring of next year. Once ground is broken, it should take approximately nine months for the complex to be completed.

Her salary for the next four years will increase with the consumer price index, not to exceed 4.5 percent, every July 1.
